New Sophomore Pioneers welcomed as Spirit of '76



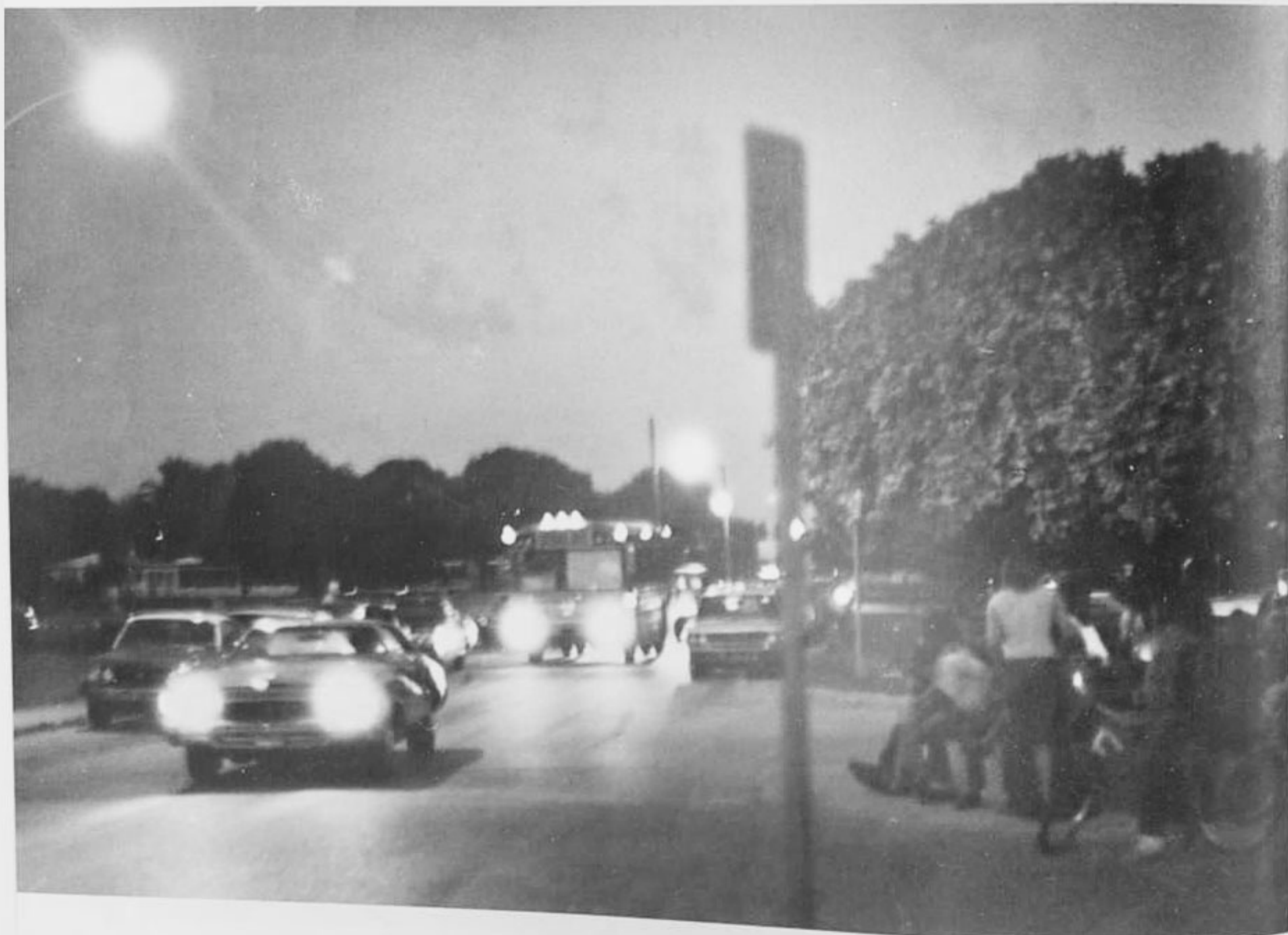

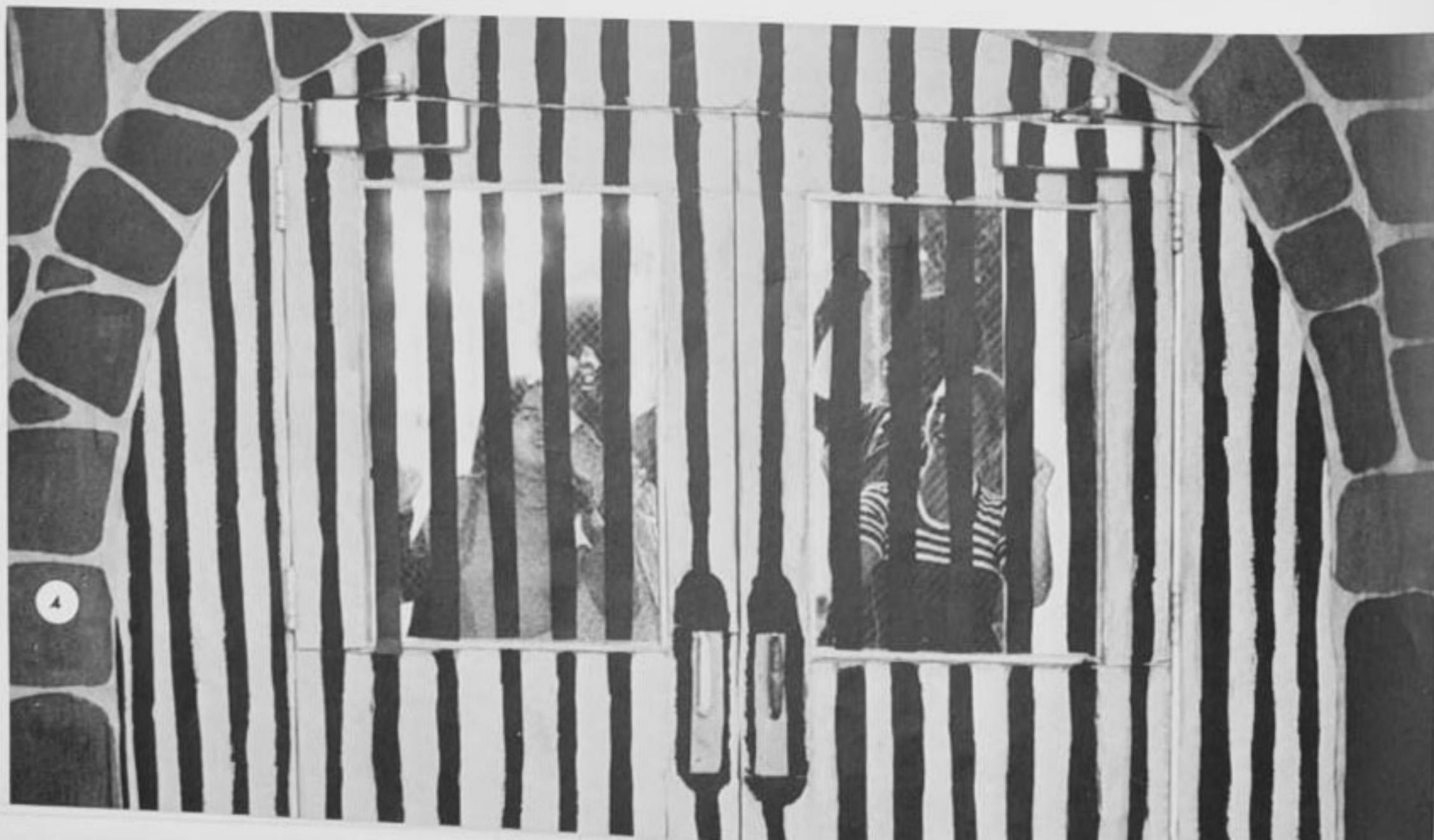

No one could have asked for a better Homecoming. Everything went our way, right down to a 20-13 victory over the North Miami Beach Chargers.

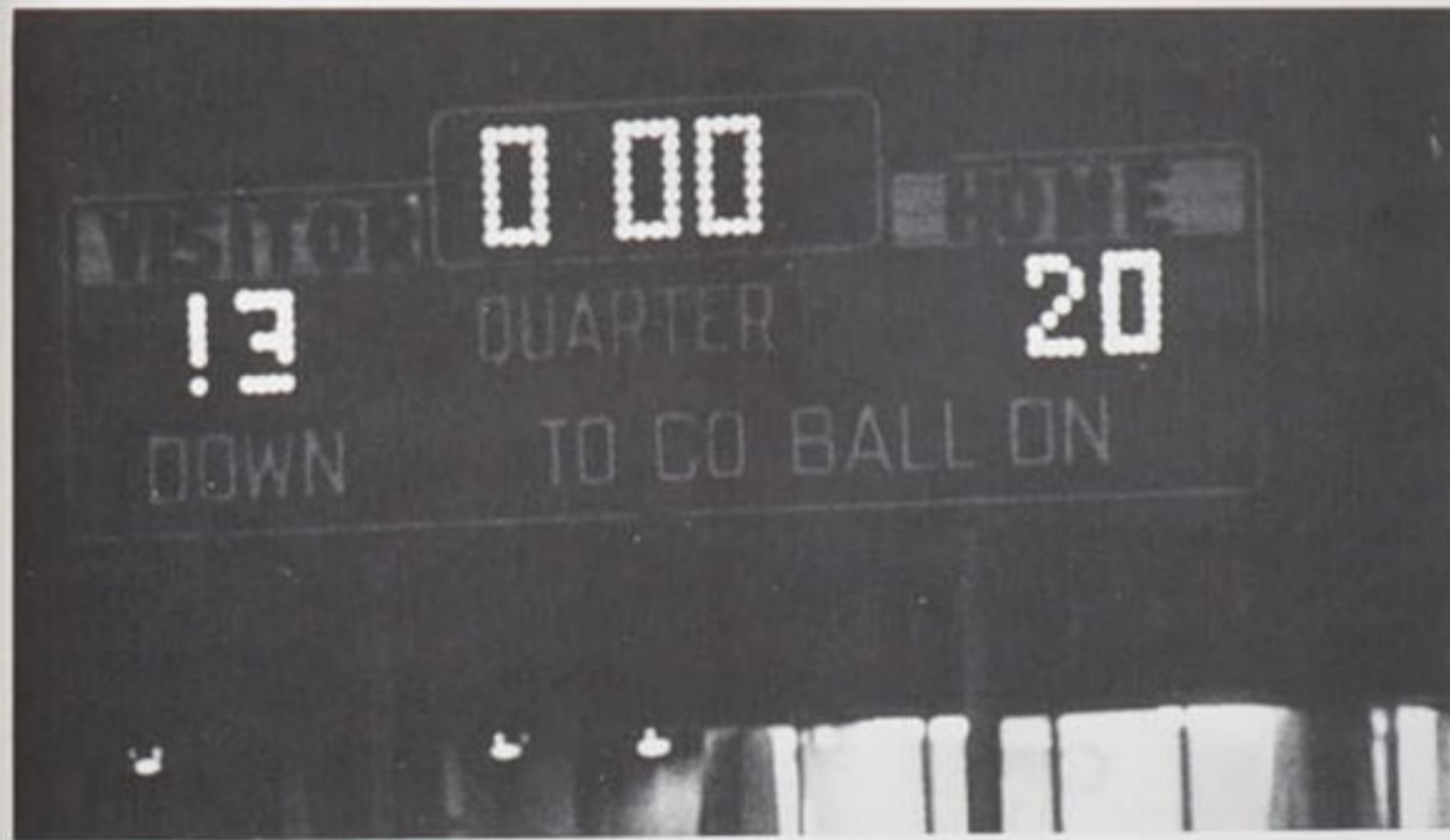
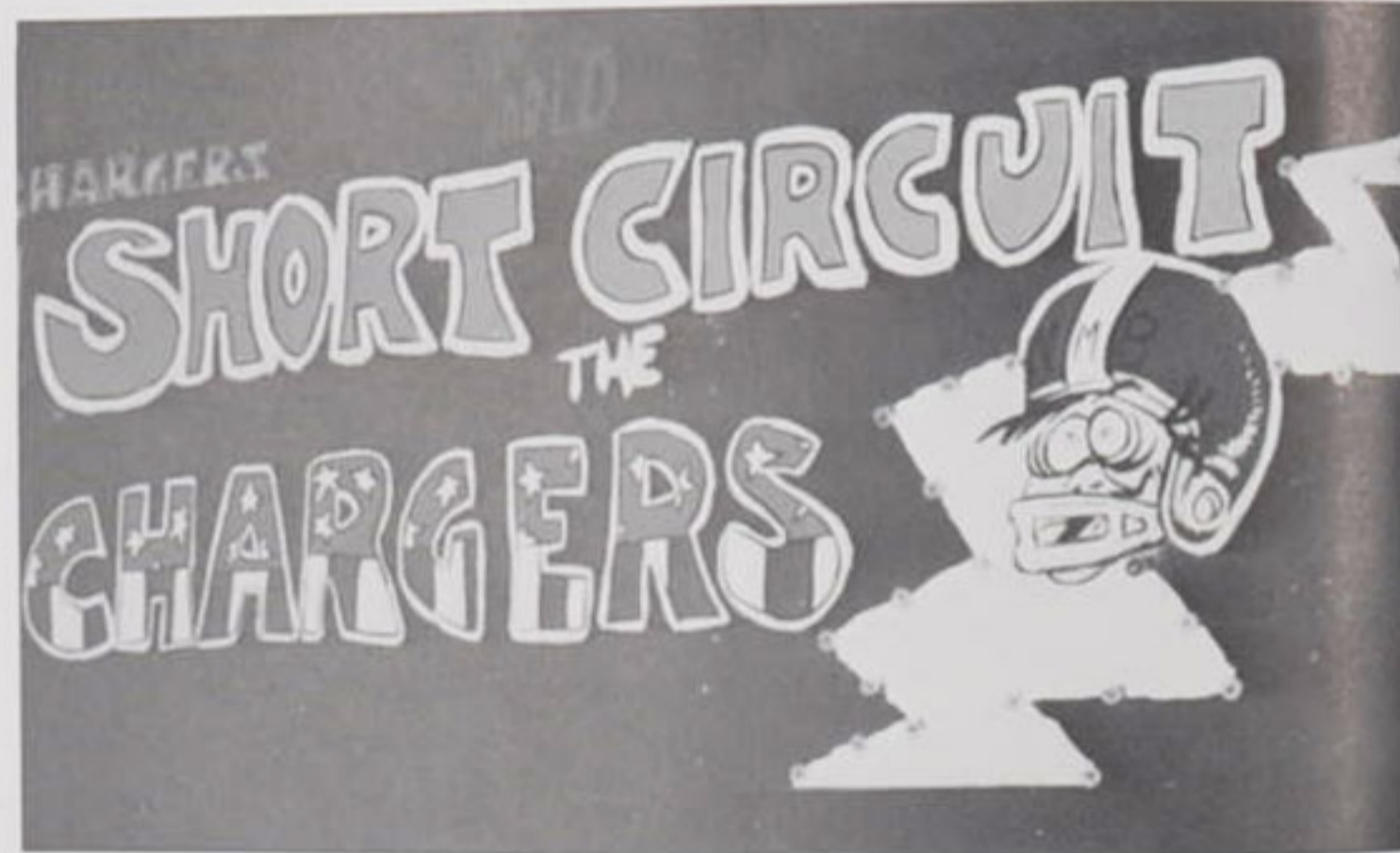
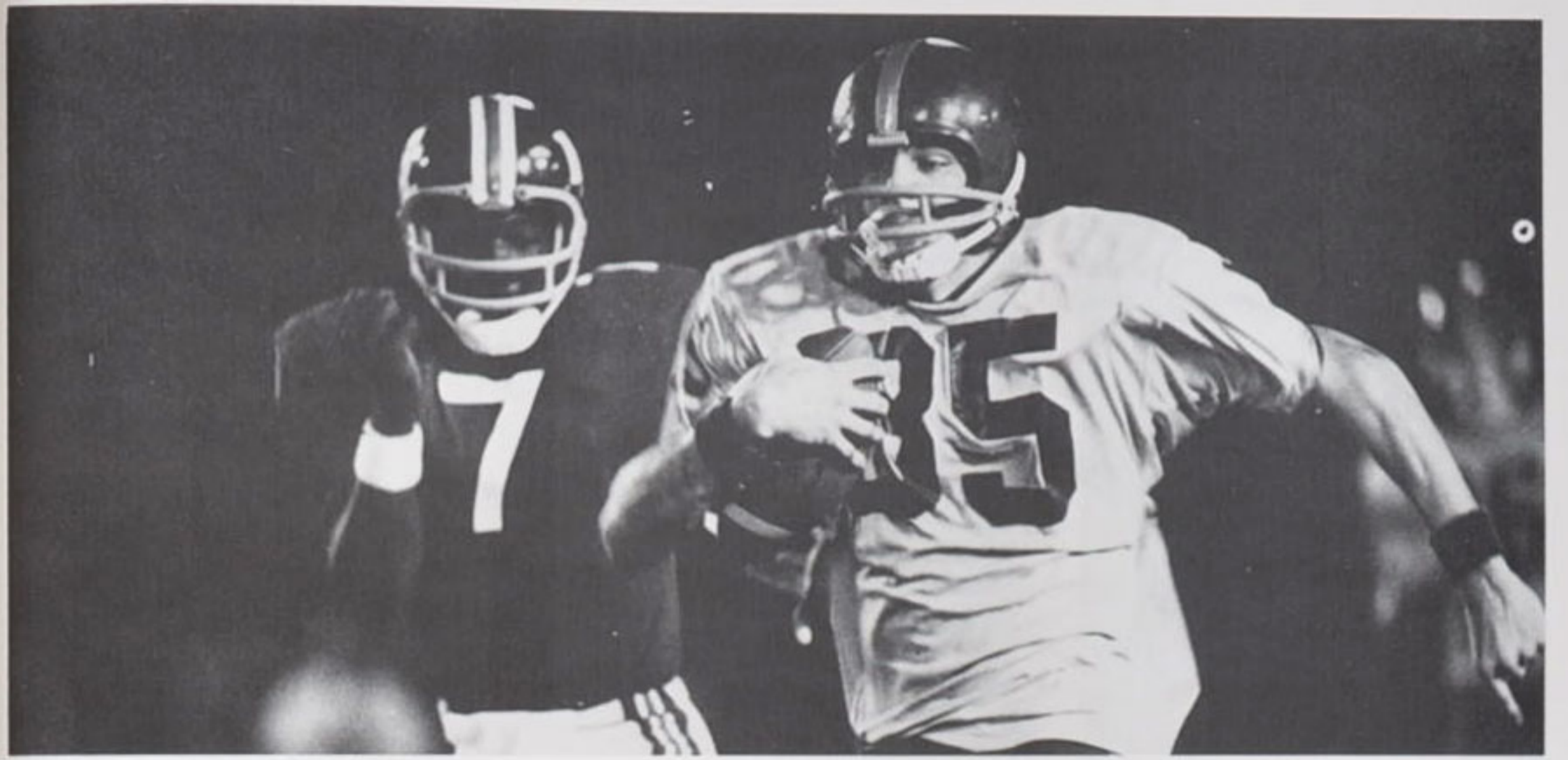
Planned and organized by Judy Loffredo and Tony Sly, the Homecoming festivities began Monday night, November 12, with a parade through the heart of town.

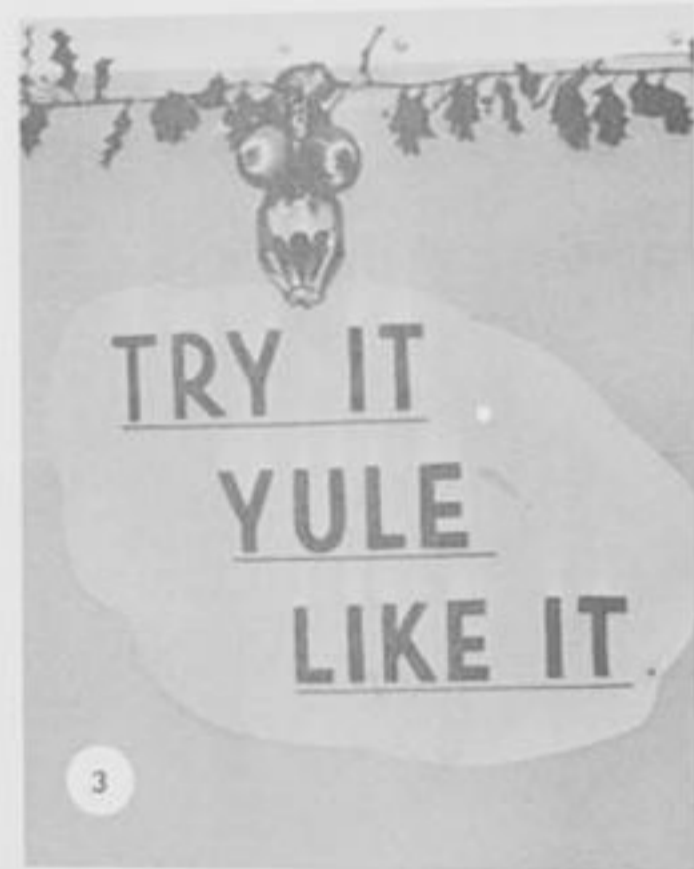
Holiday Season Blew In With a Cold Wind

Big and brassy, our pep rallies were the best!

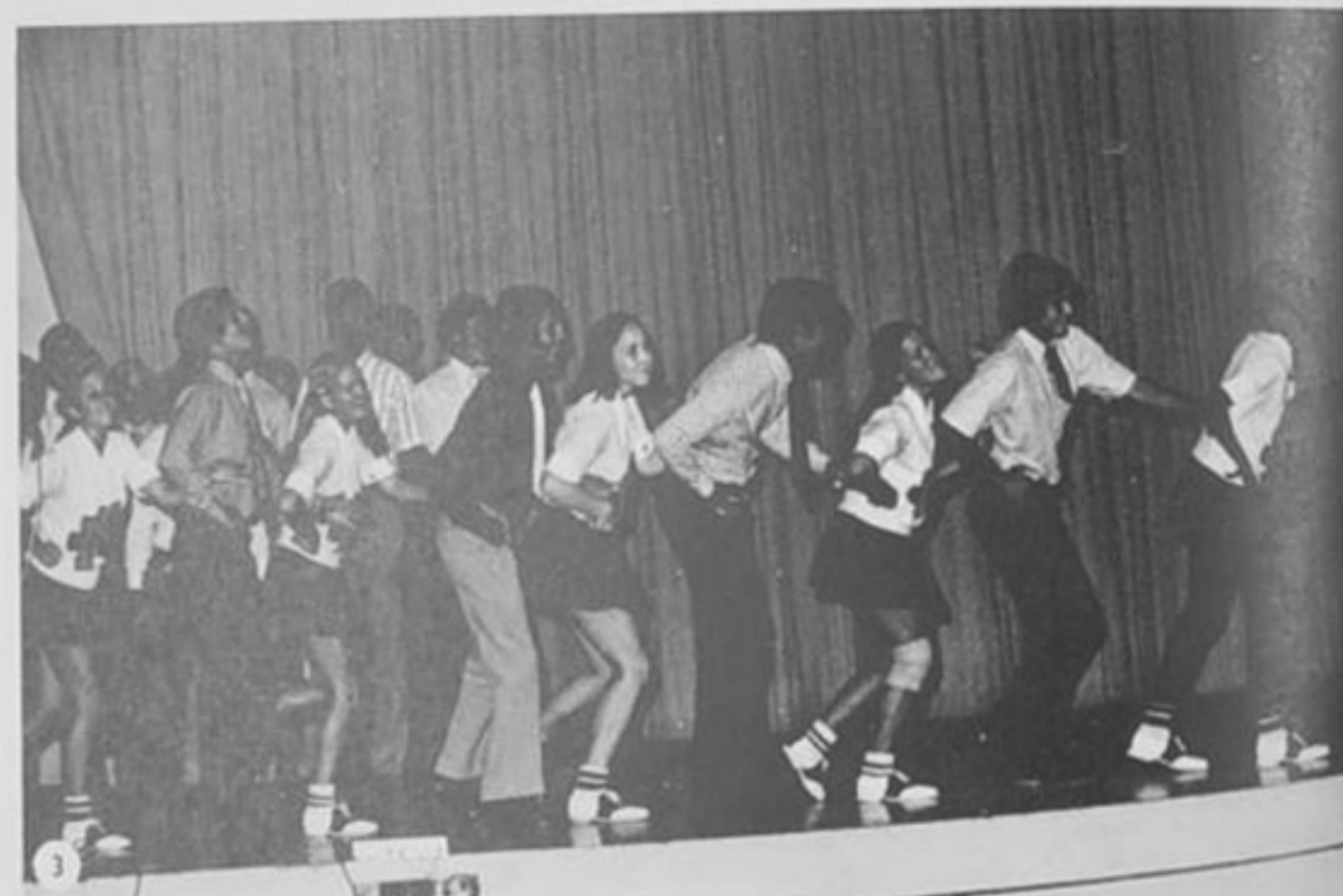

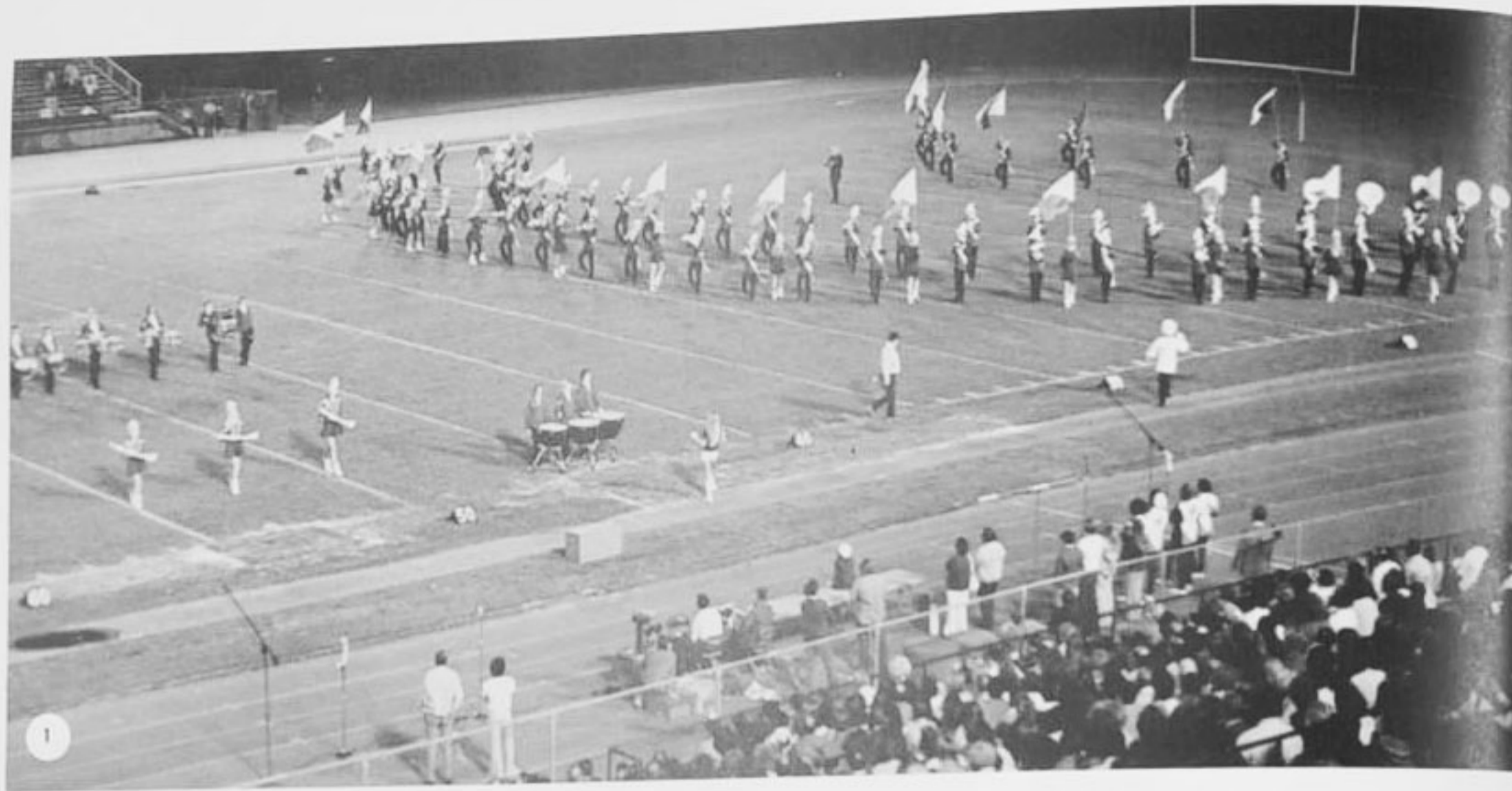

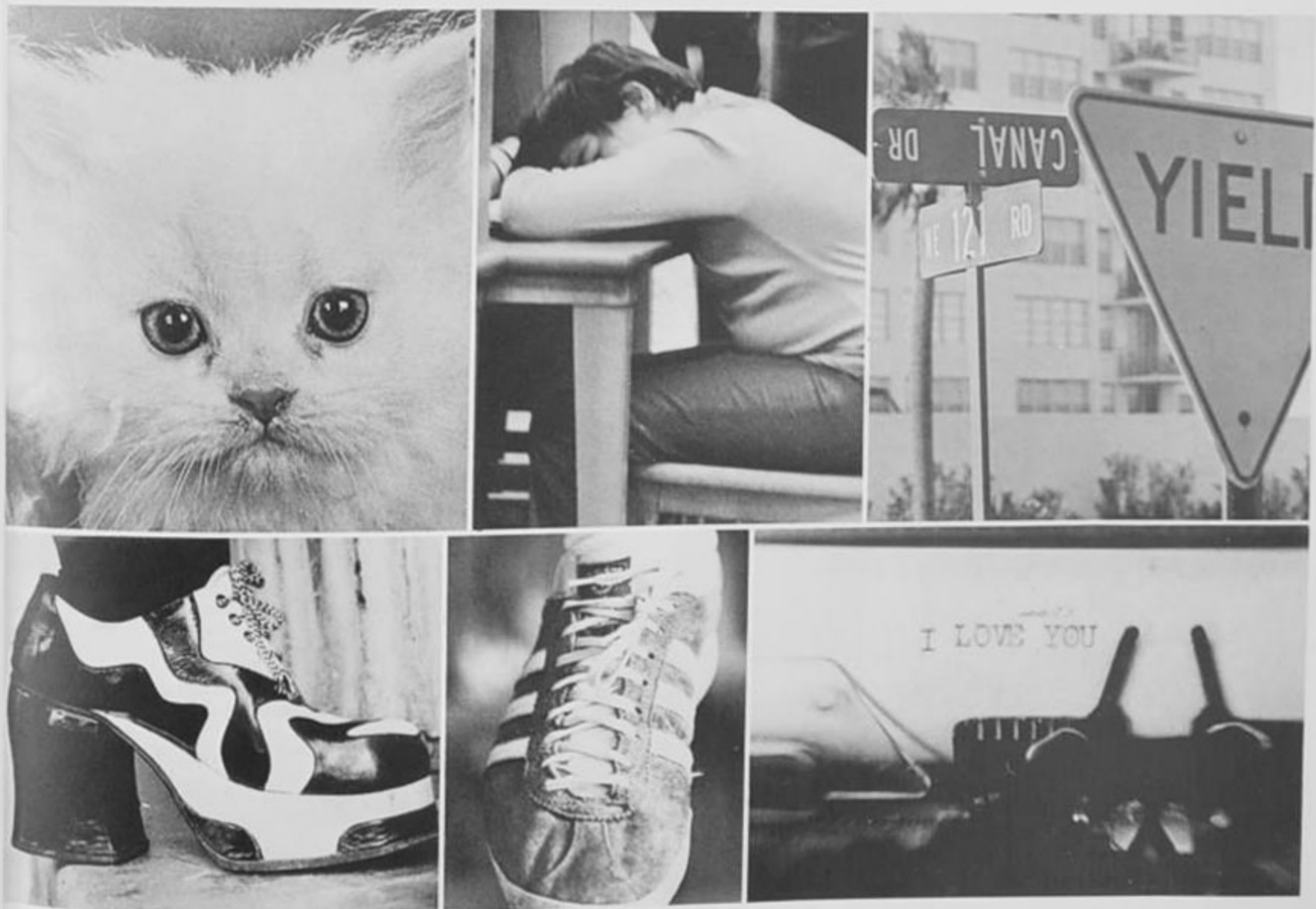

In February Stefan went to Washington, D.C., through the National Close Up program.



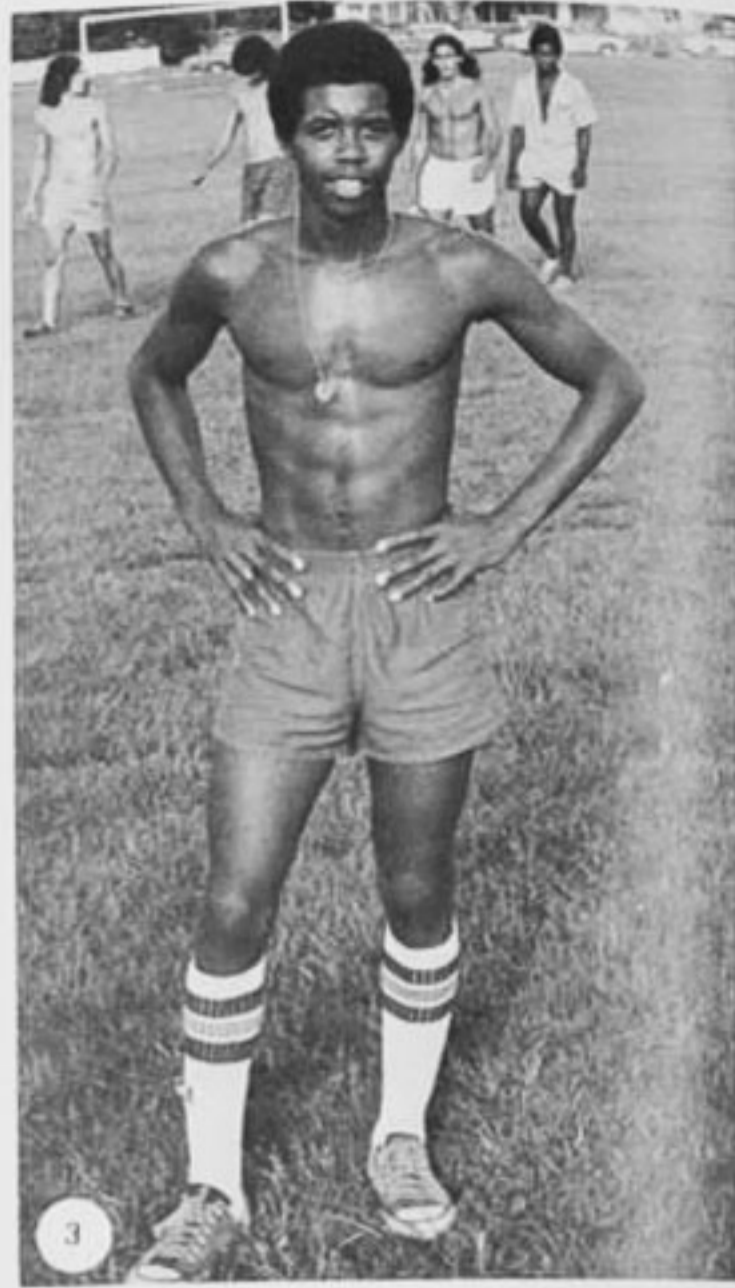

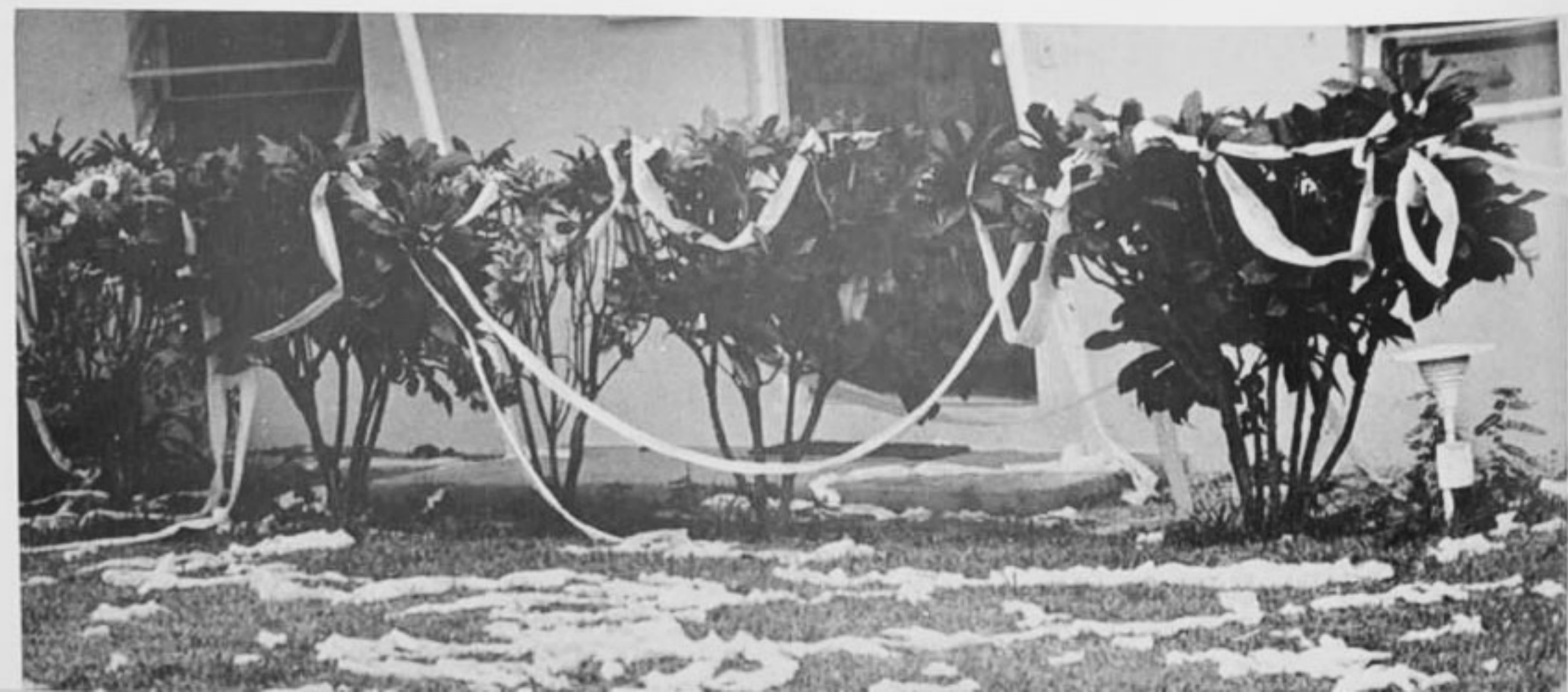
For the 11 students who traveled to Washington with Mrs. Lemmie Mitchell, they learned all that, and more.

The Close Up program gave many high school students the opportunity to see their National Representatives working for them. They saw government close up!

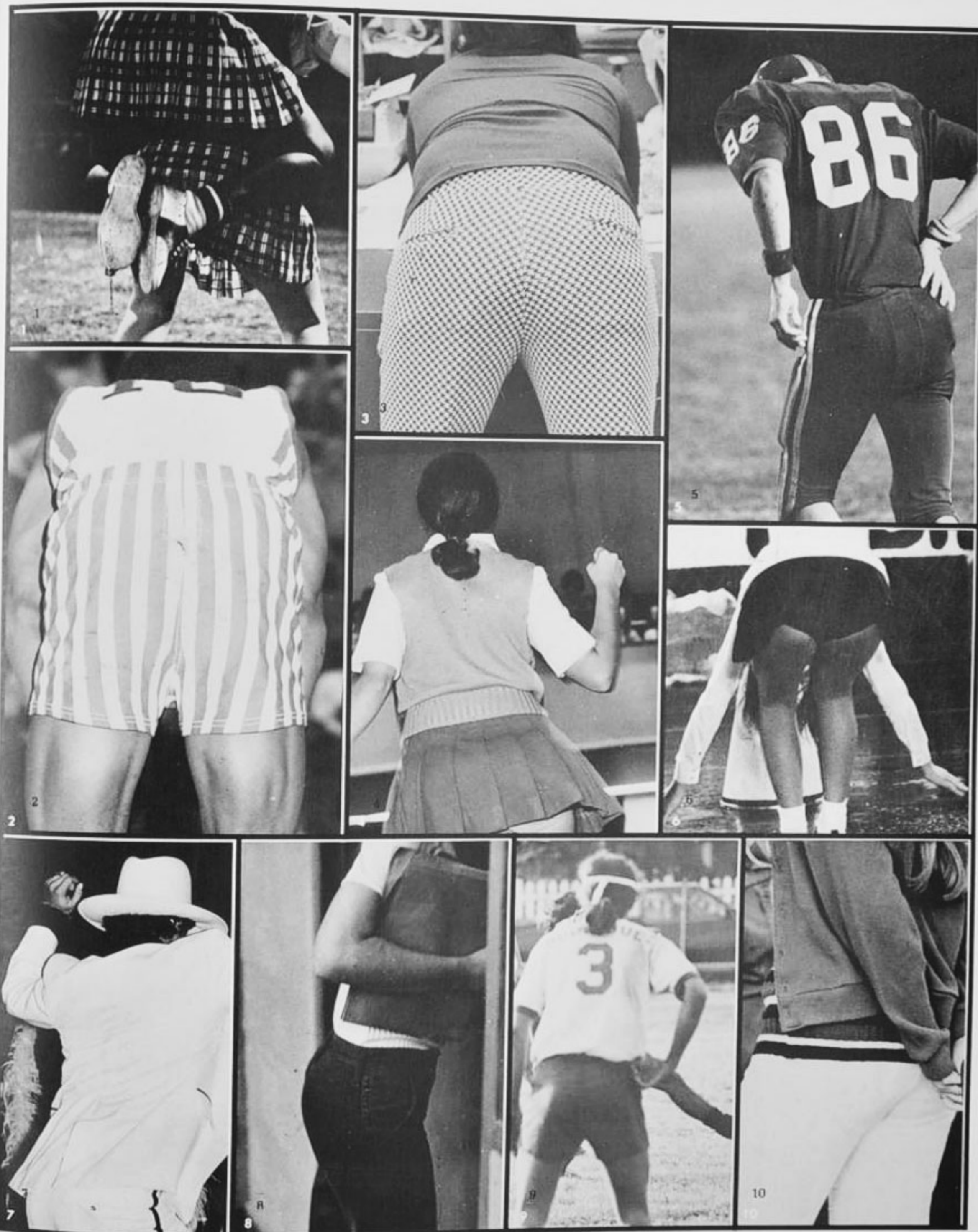

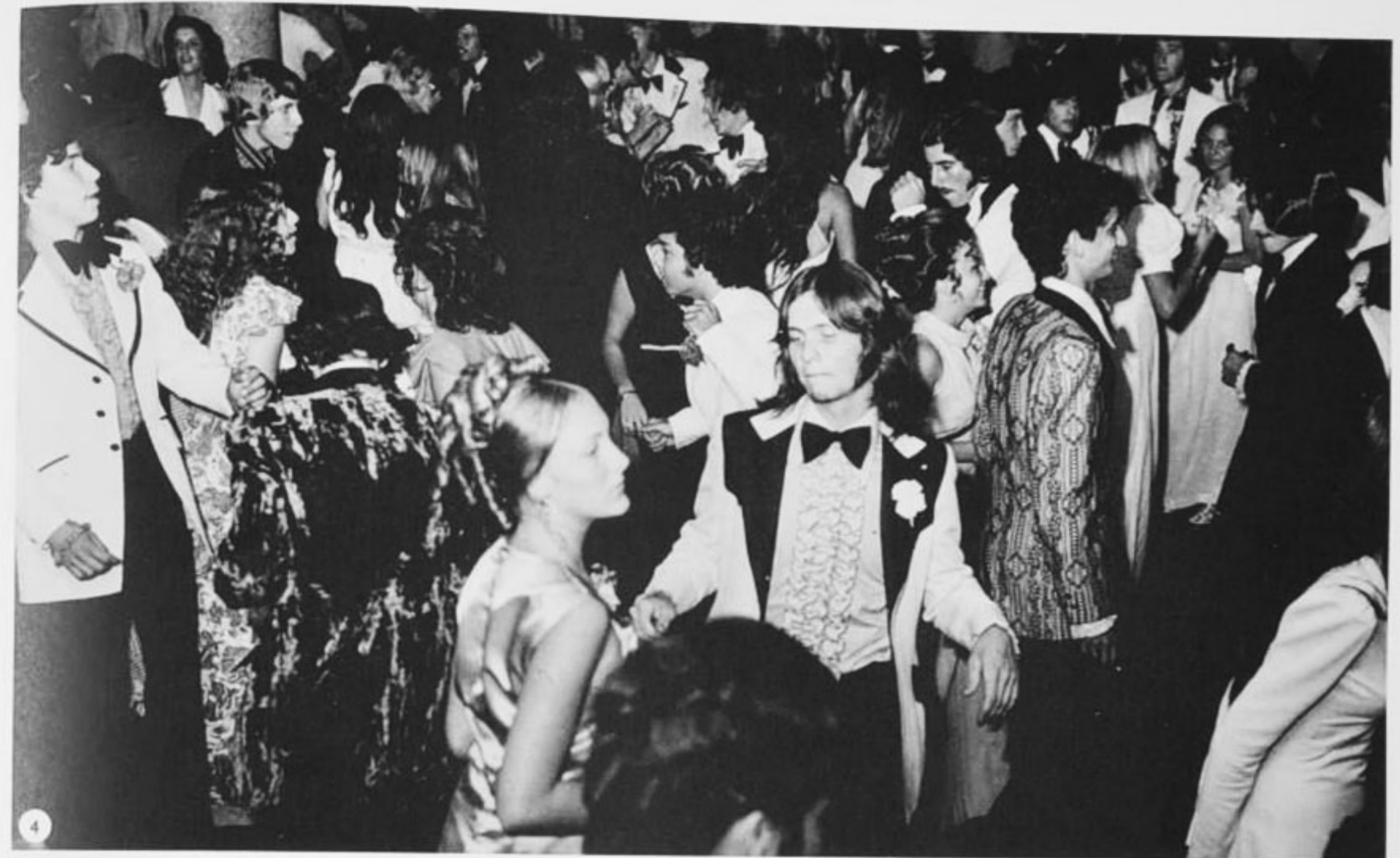


Junior-Senior Prom: Our last undergraduate fling

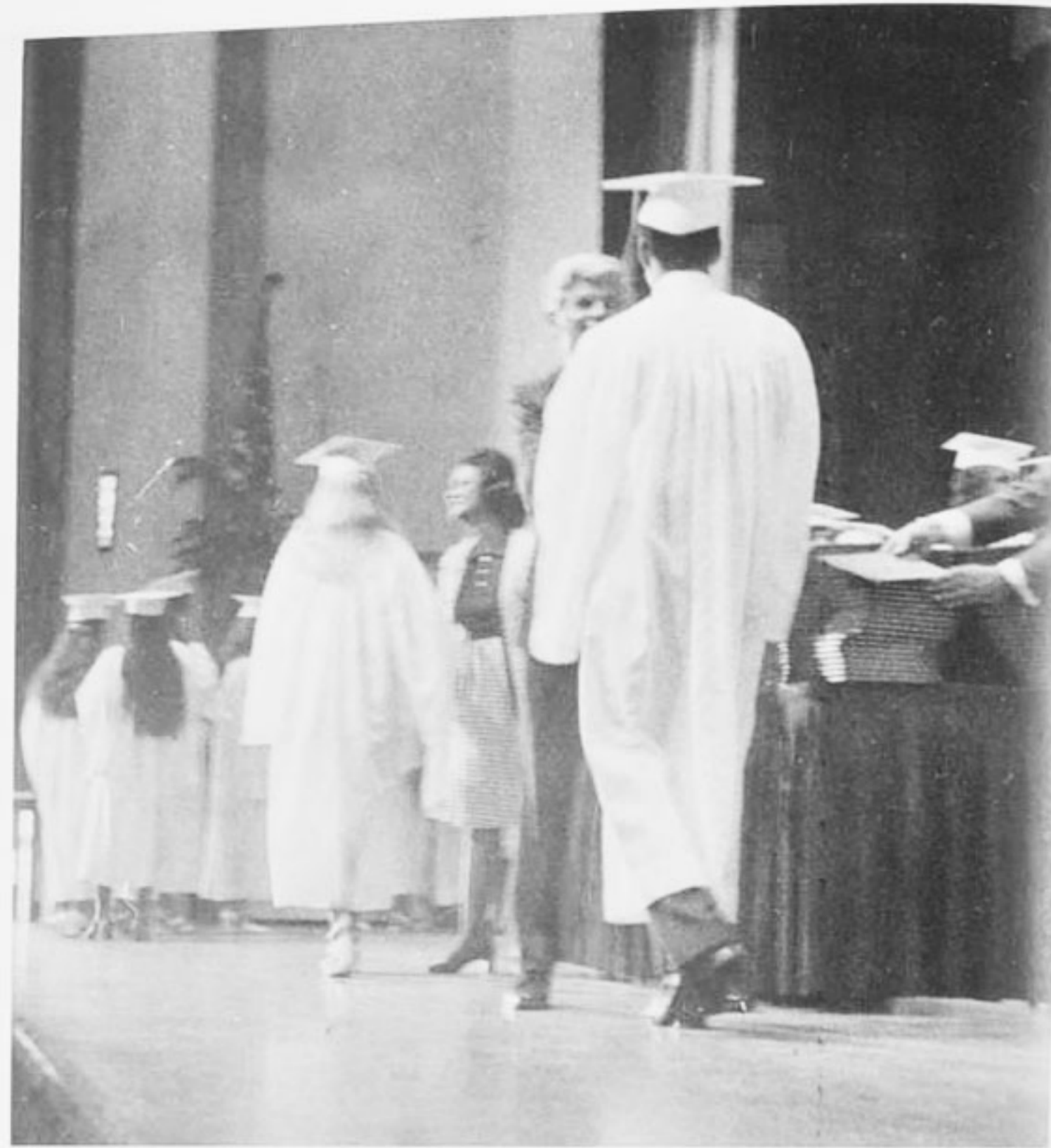

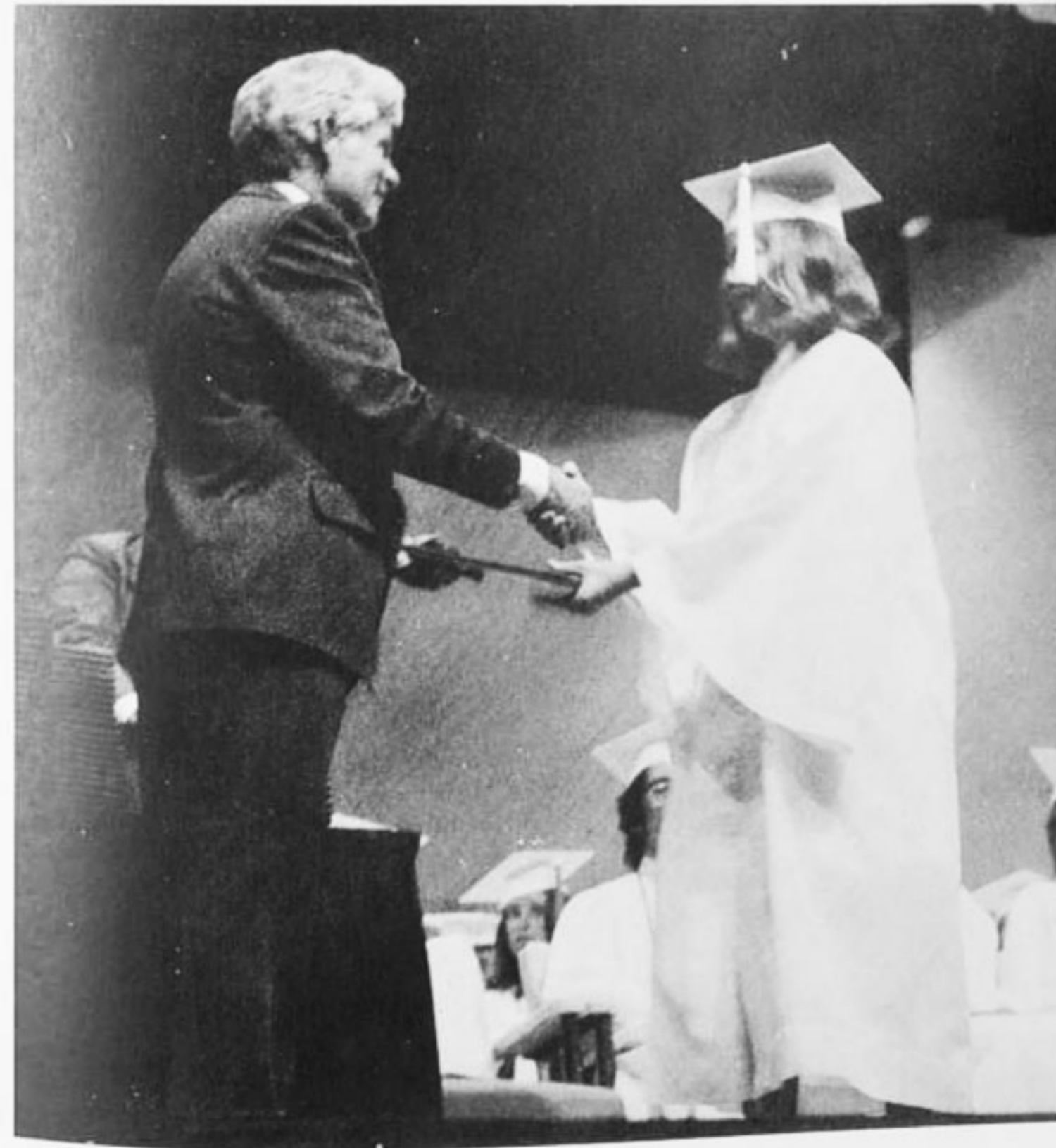

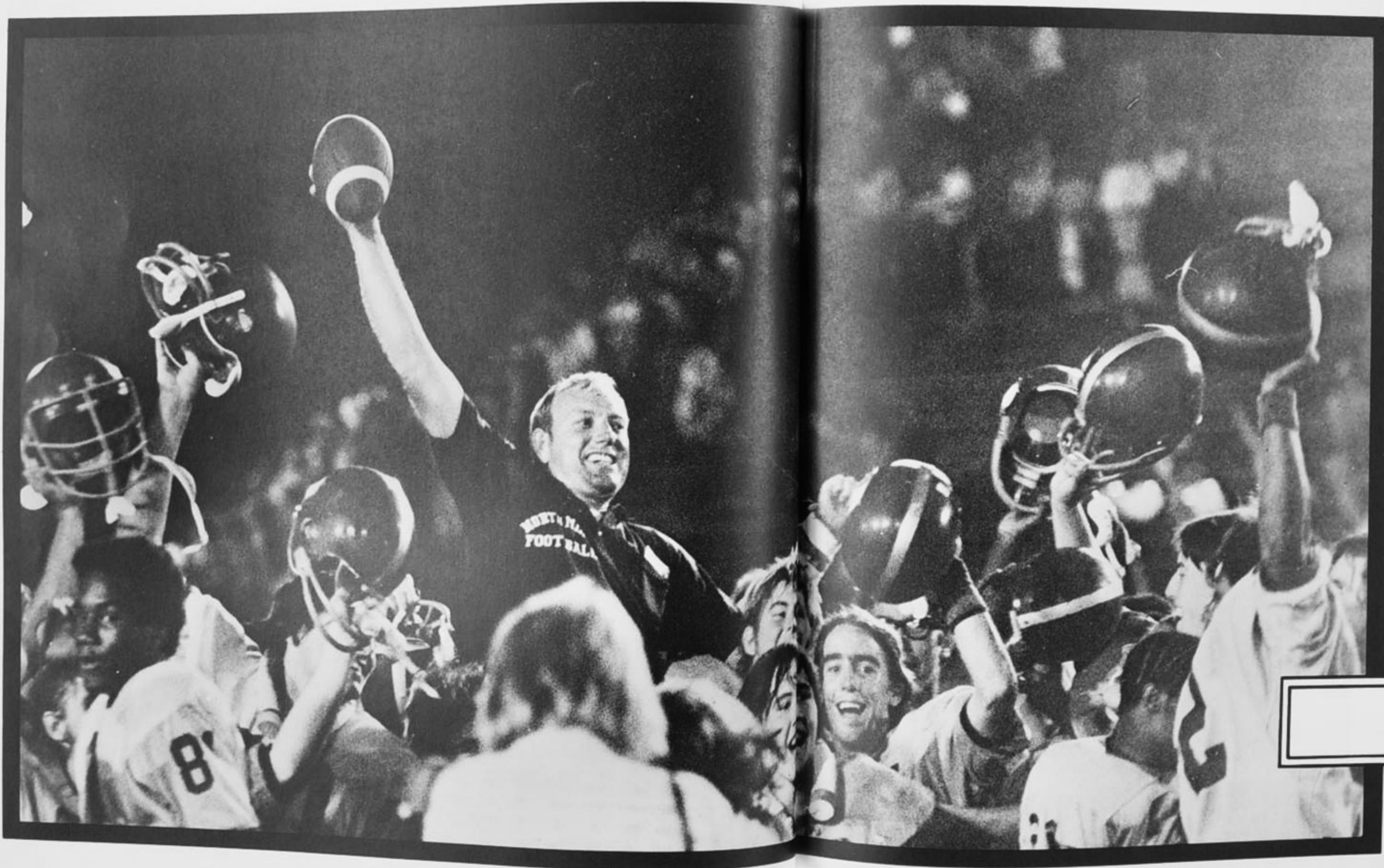
This is it — Graduation Day for the class of '74!

Along with the tassel and diploma, seniors will have much to remind them of North Miami. For each there will be a montage of feelings, thoughts and memories of experiences shared with classmates.

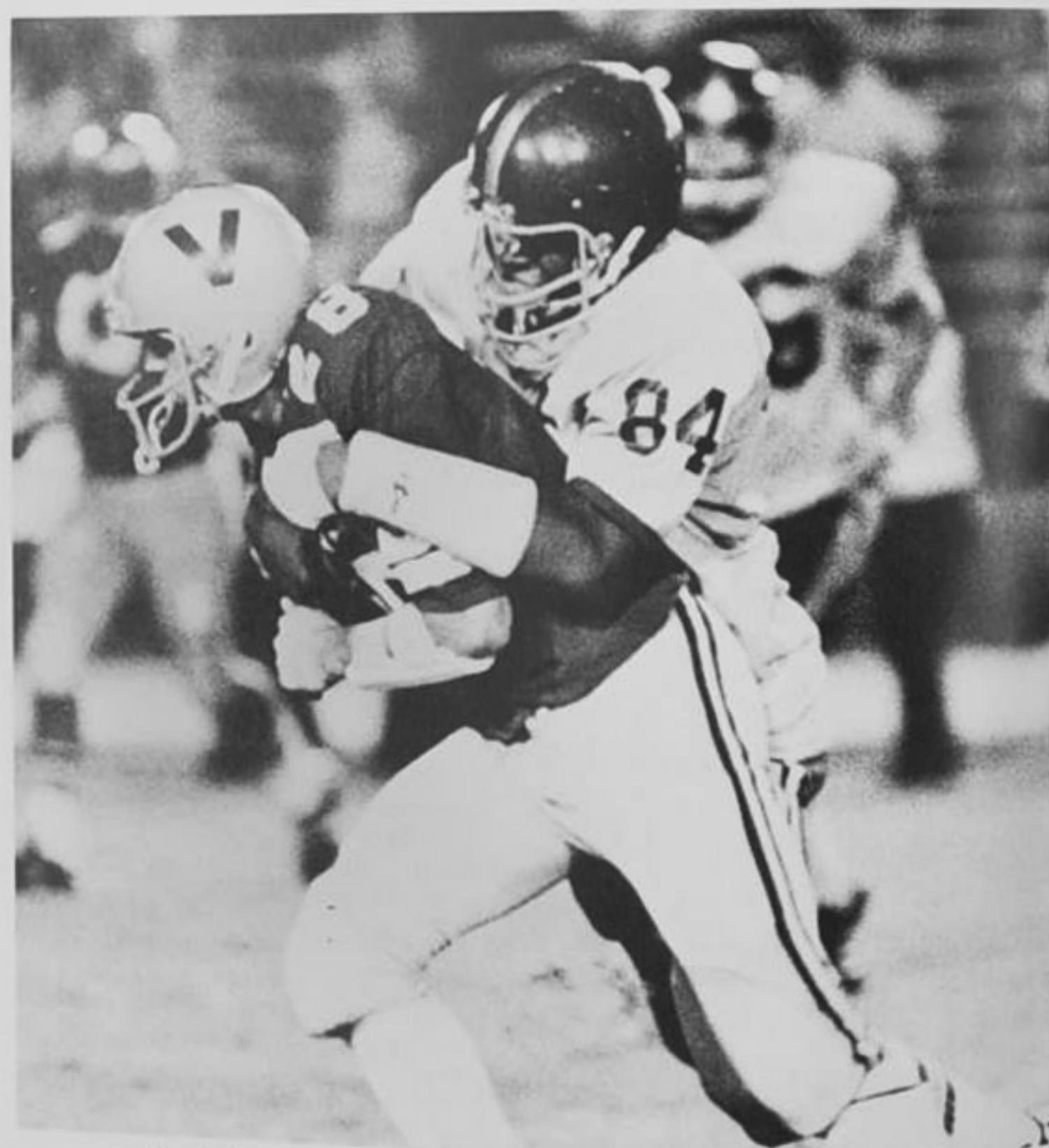

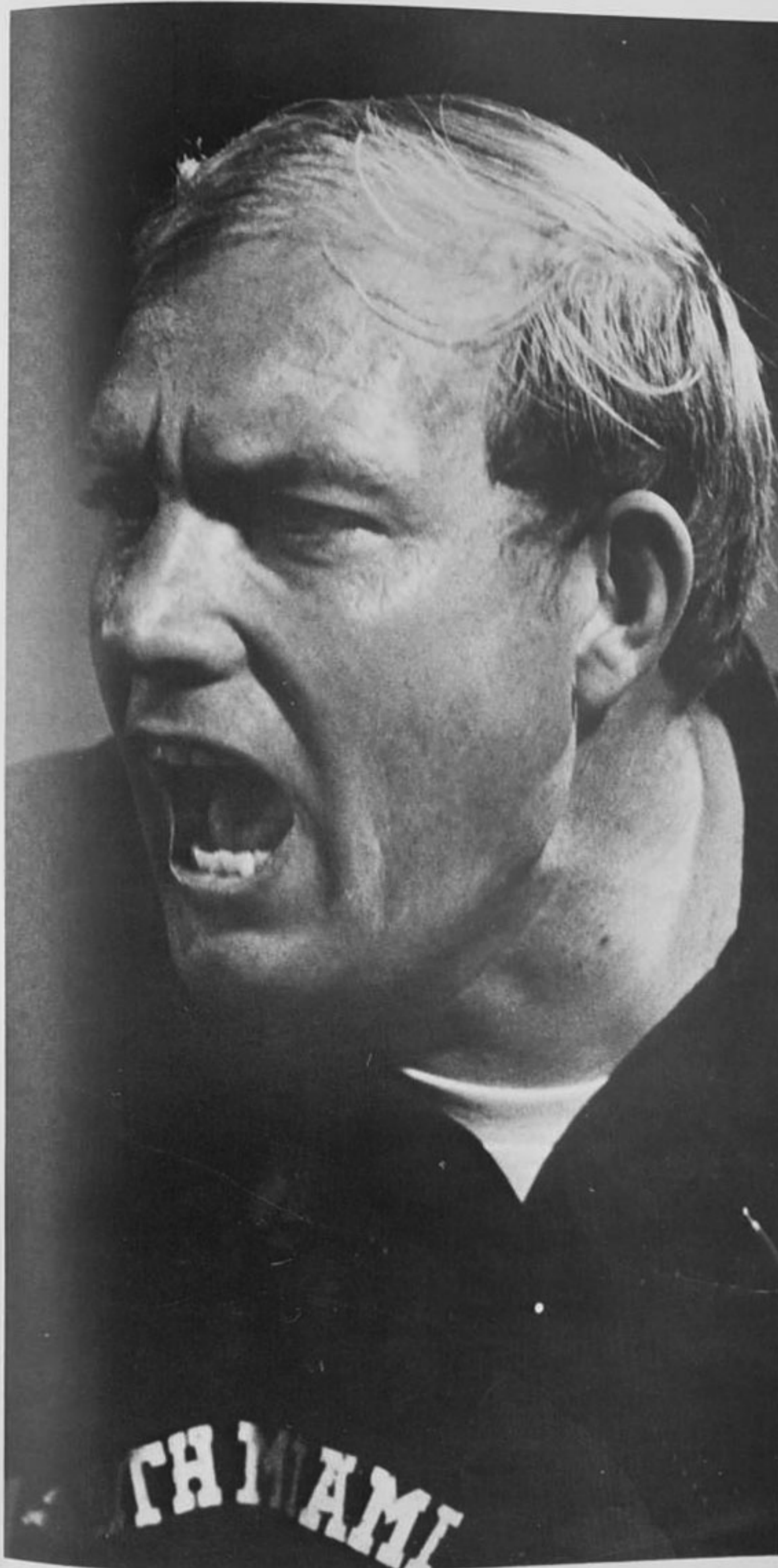

Many of our football fans continue to rave about our strong season finale and the upset of the highly favored North Miami Beach Chargers.

Pioneer followers may recall the 20-13 upset and the tremendous game our squad played. I'm disappointed that we didn't win more games, but I'm proud of the way our young men performed.

This past season, for the most part, was an exciting one for the fans. Last year we had great difficulty in putting points on the board, but this year we were exciting on offense. Our passing game was Number One in the county and our ability to move the ball on the ground seemed to improve with each game.

One should recognize that the success in running and throwing the ball was not possible without the blocking of our line. Before our season began I felt the inexperience of our offensive linemen would be a weakness. As it turned out, they were our strength.

We had some frustration on defense but I know they gave everything they had. In many of our games our defense had people playing who were hurt but they had the kind of pride that every coach looks for.

Our squad, though small in numbers (forty-two) was large in pride and character. It must have been depressing to have local newspapers pick you 2-8 but it certainly didn't affect our players. They set to work with diligence to get the job done, and they did.

This was to be a close one with the Chargers favored by one point.

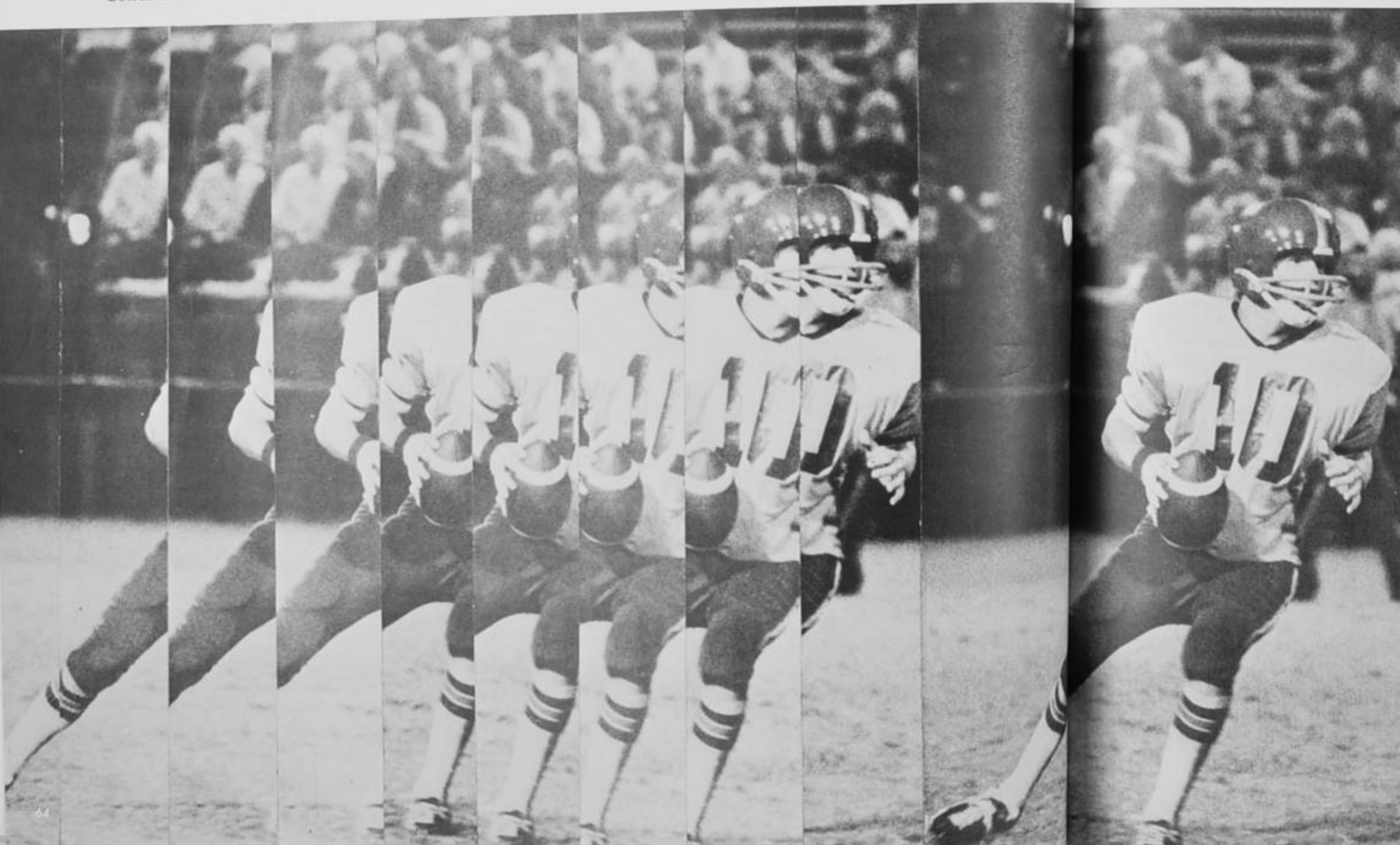

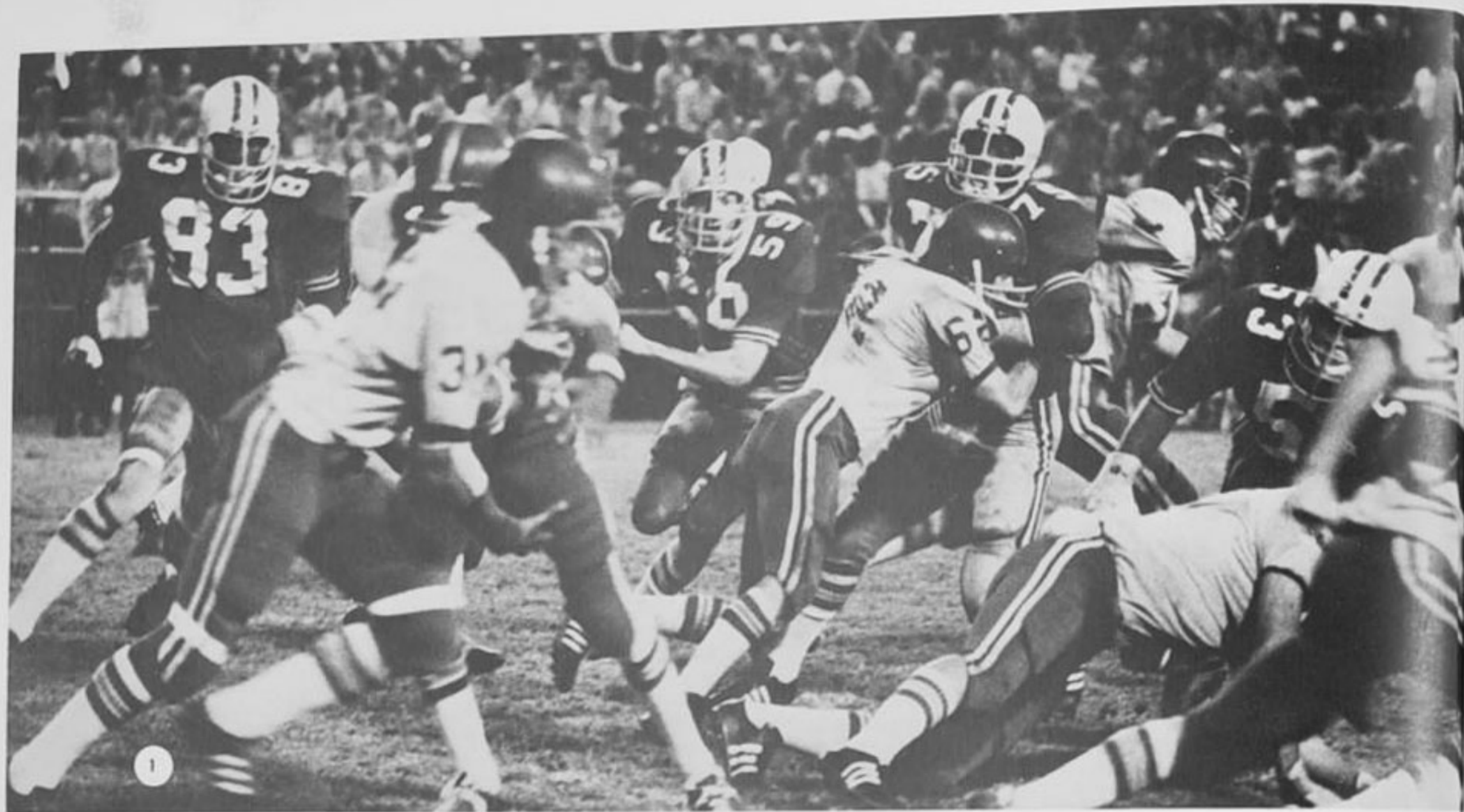

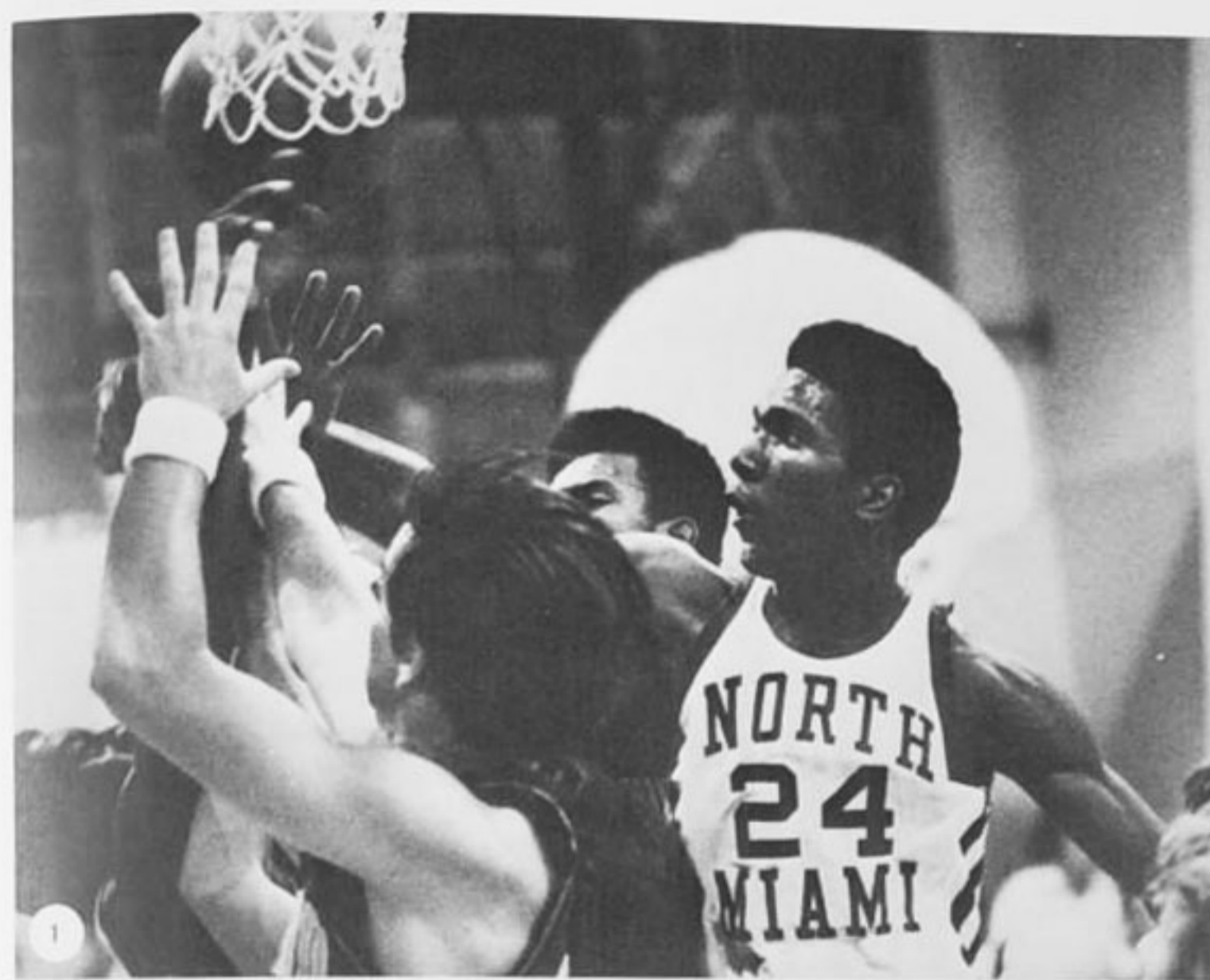
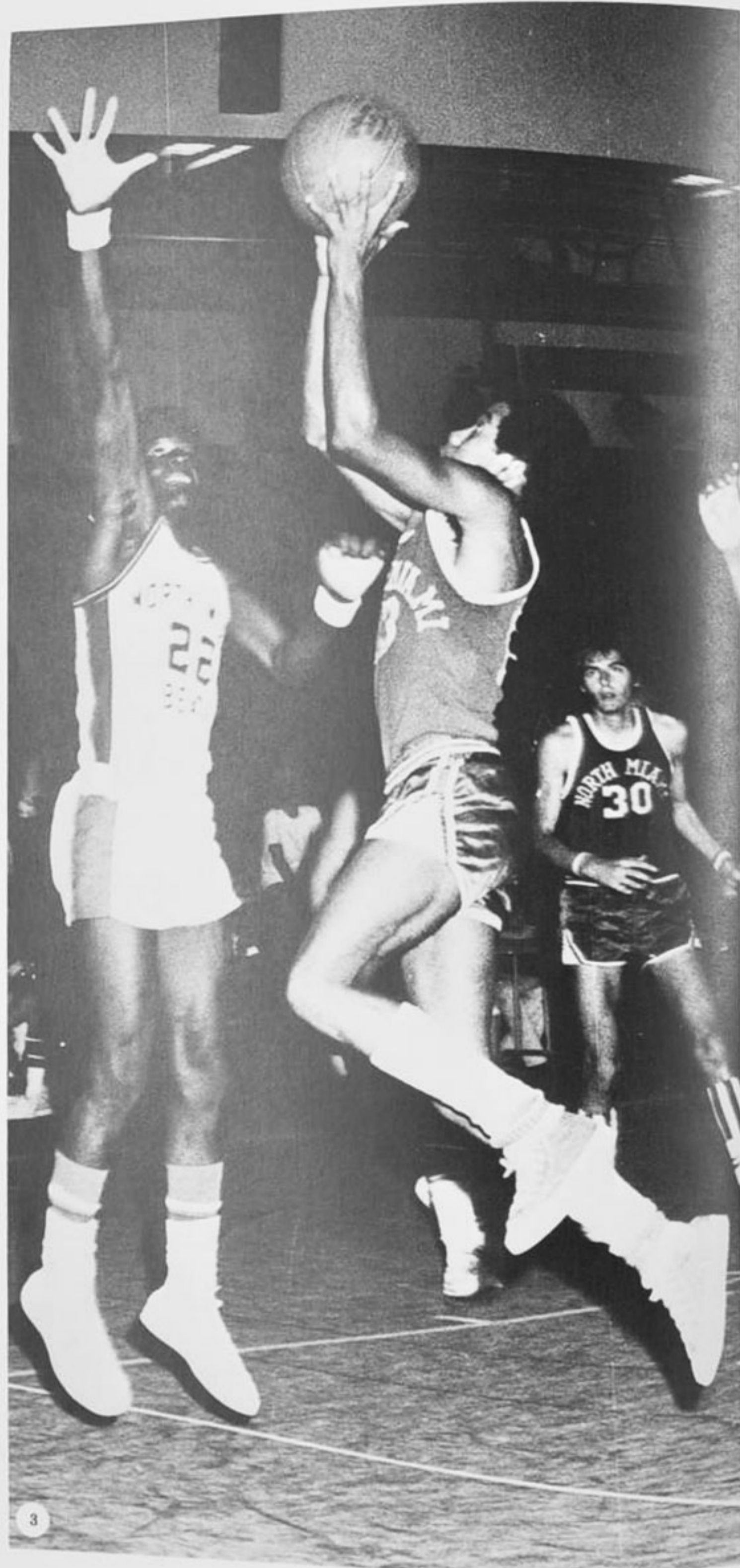

Junior Varsity: A Stepping Stone for the Future



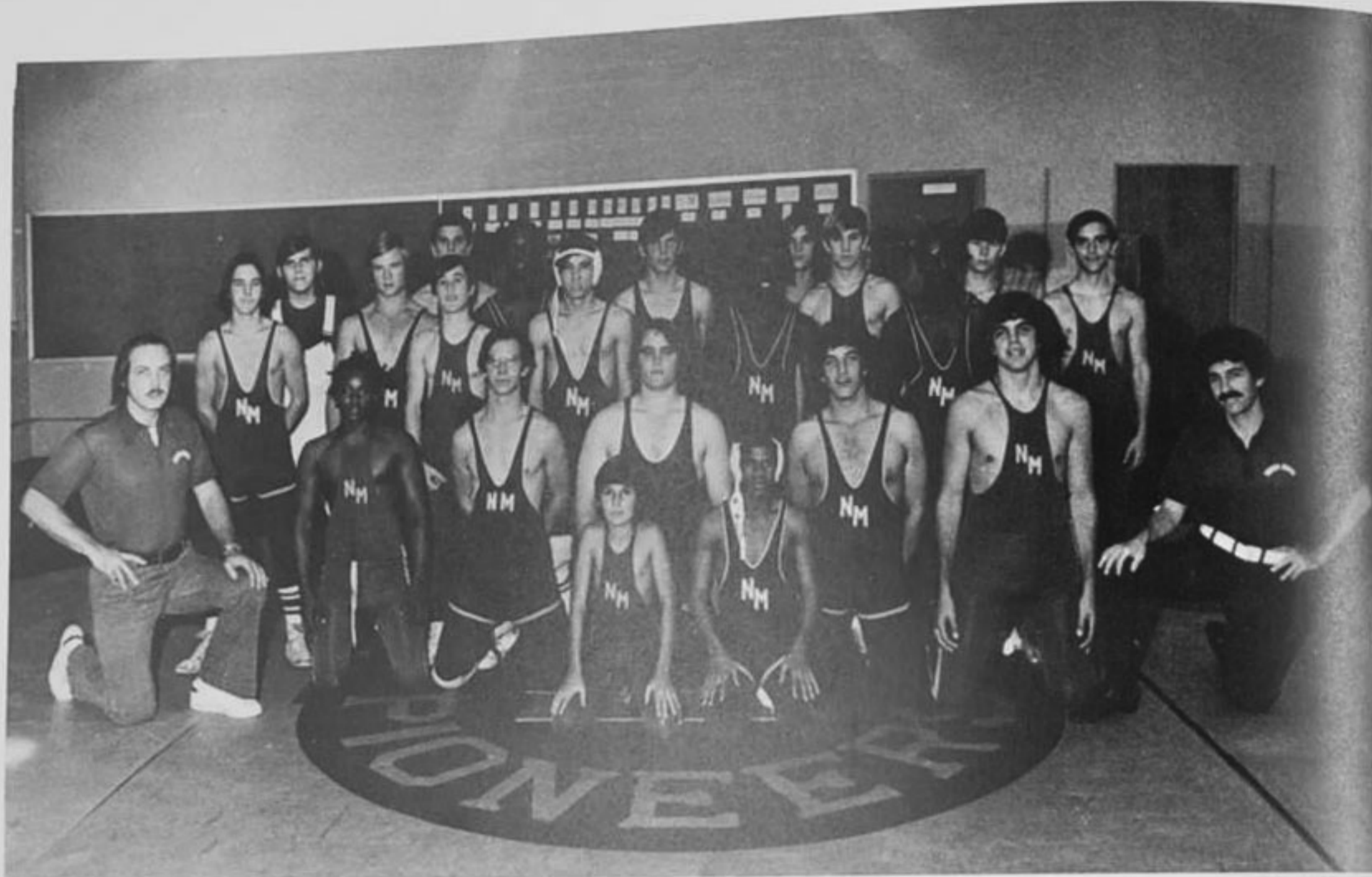

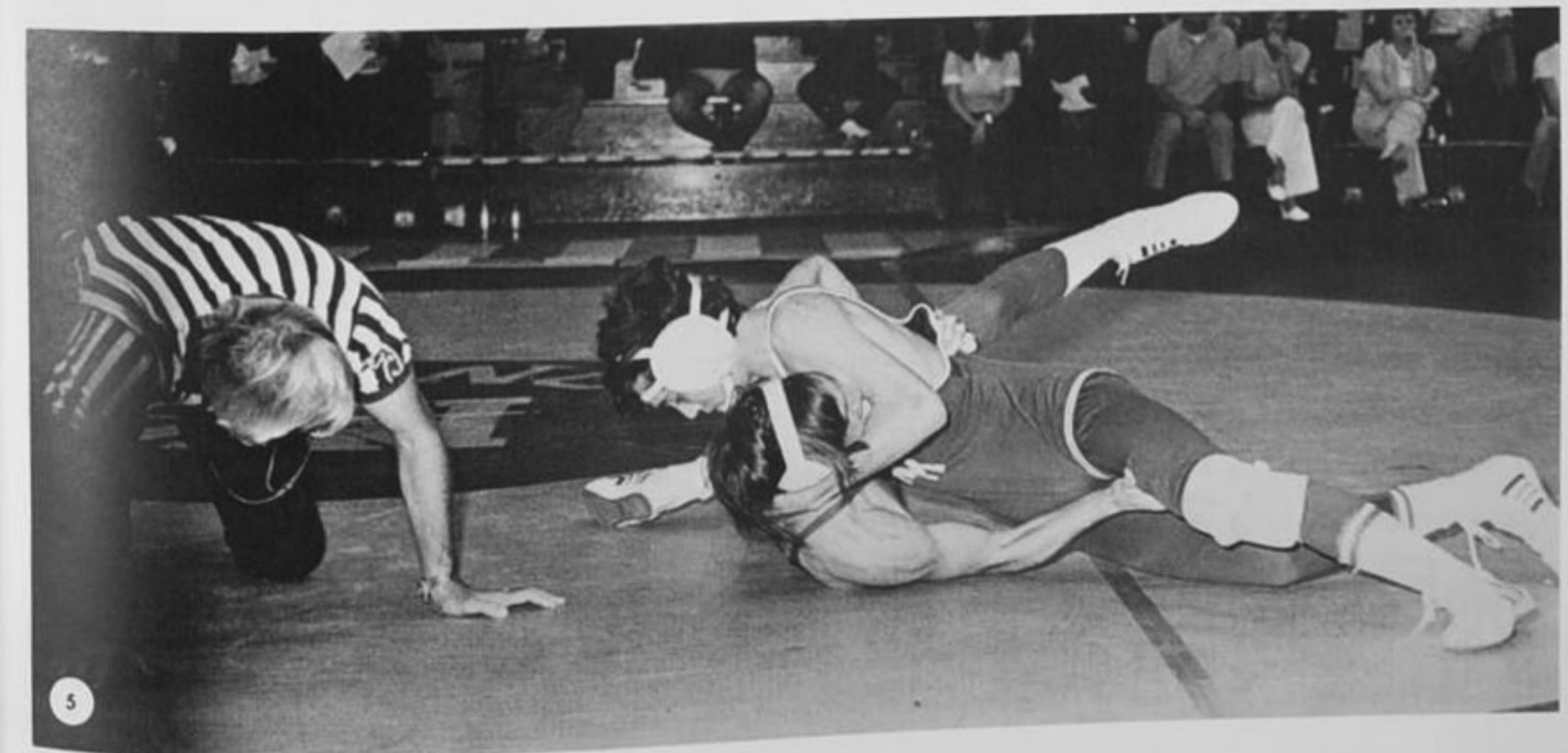

New coach Larry Lancaster pulled the team together and provided the leadership for a successful season.

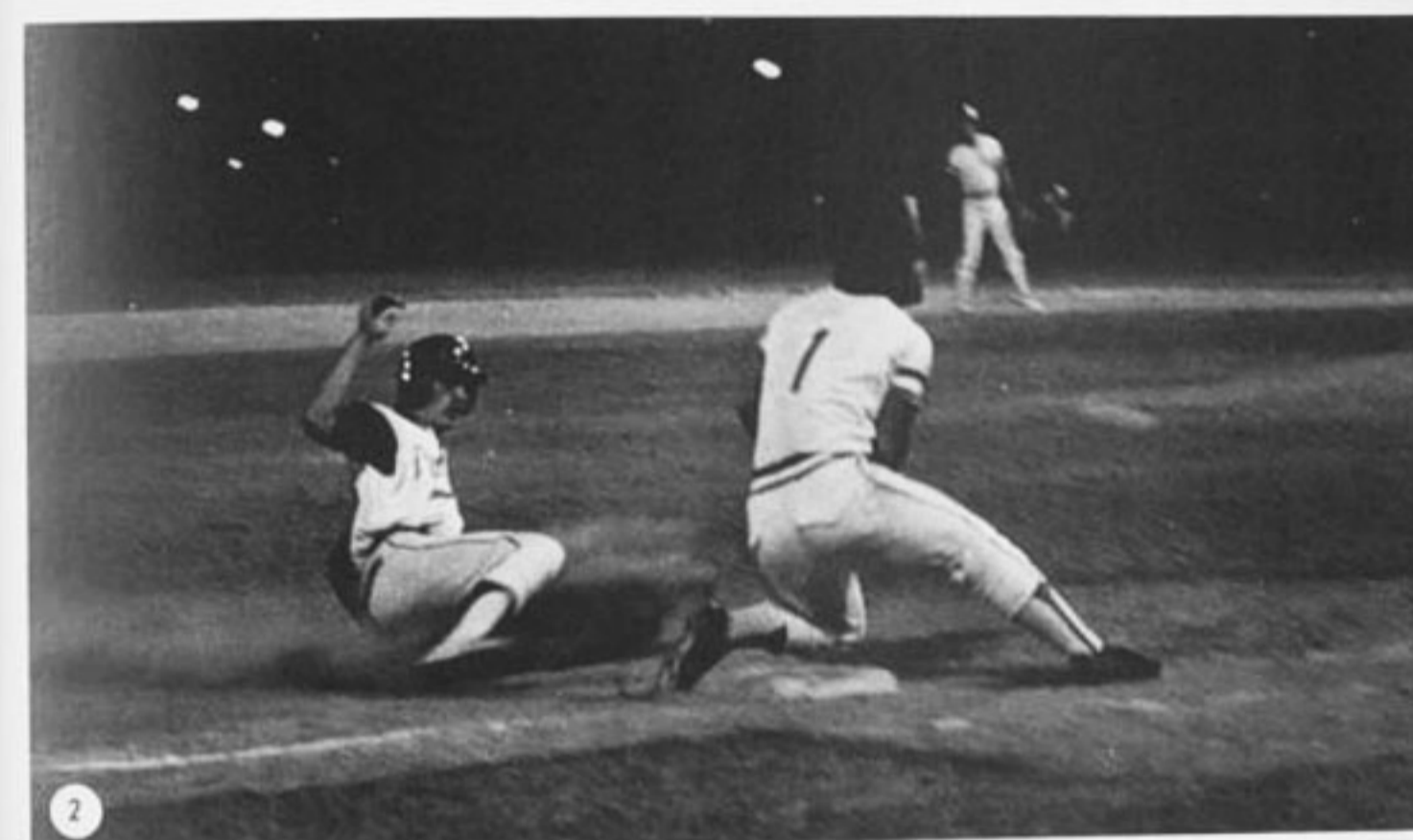

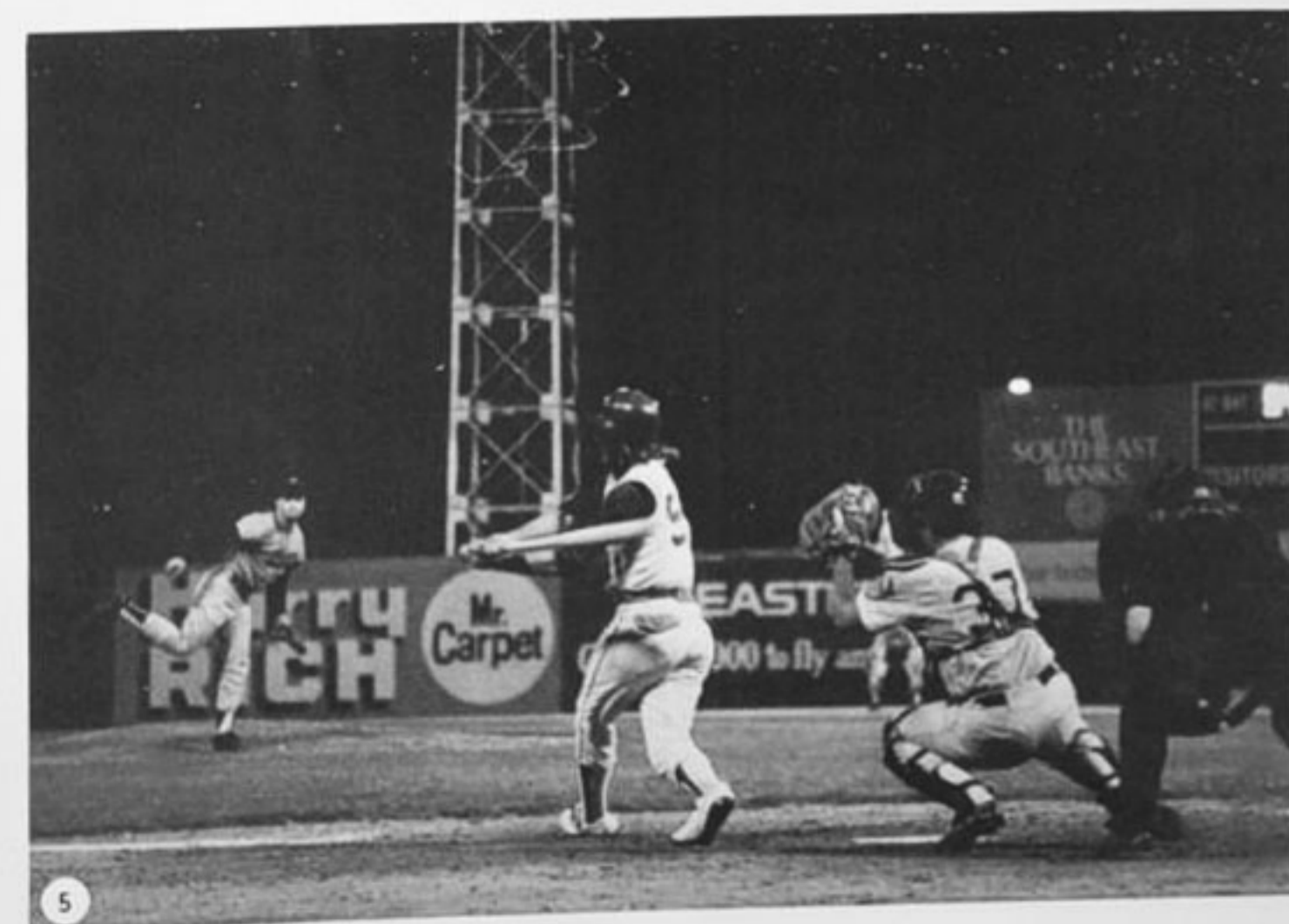

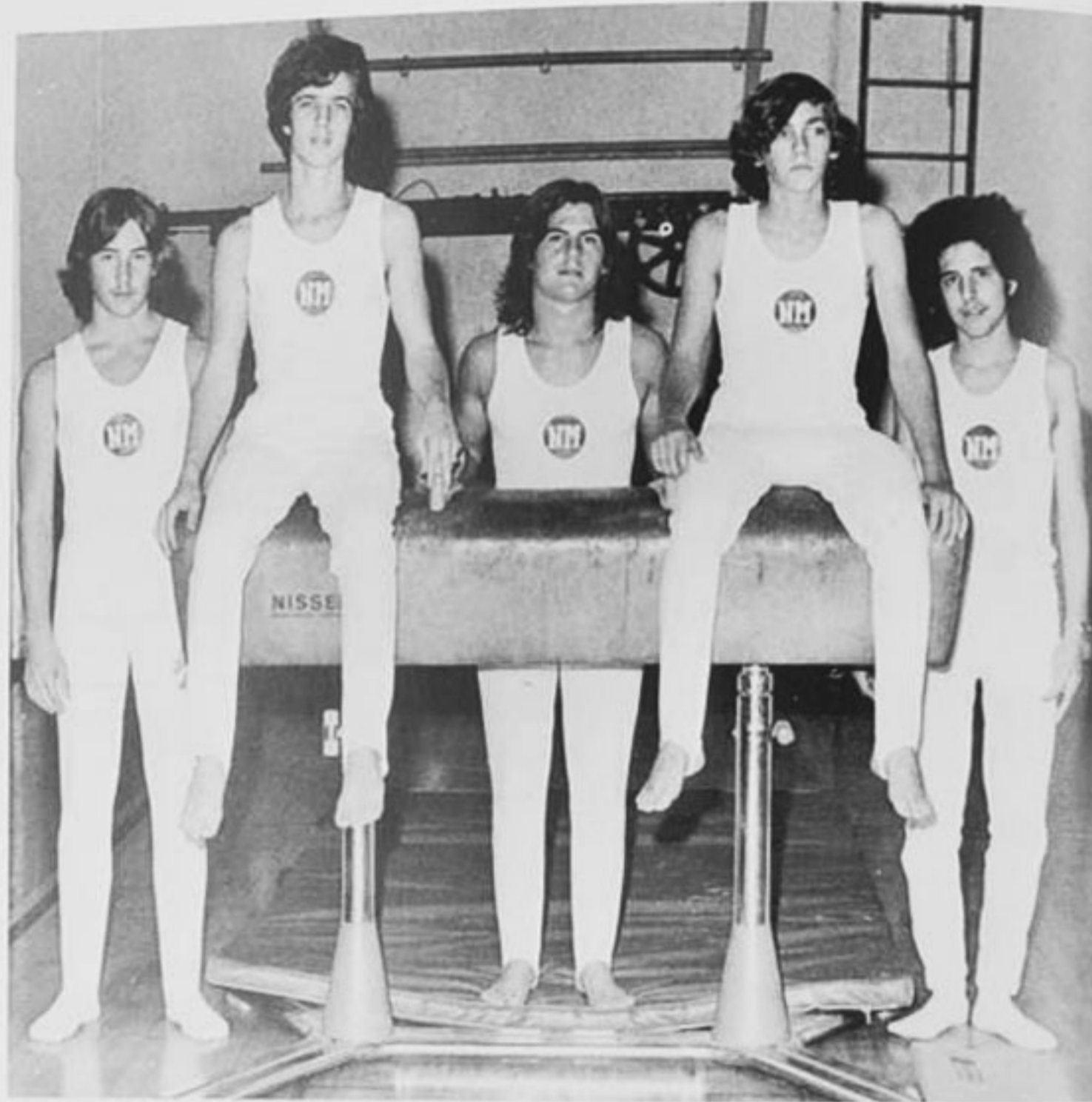


Gymnasts opened their competition with new coach

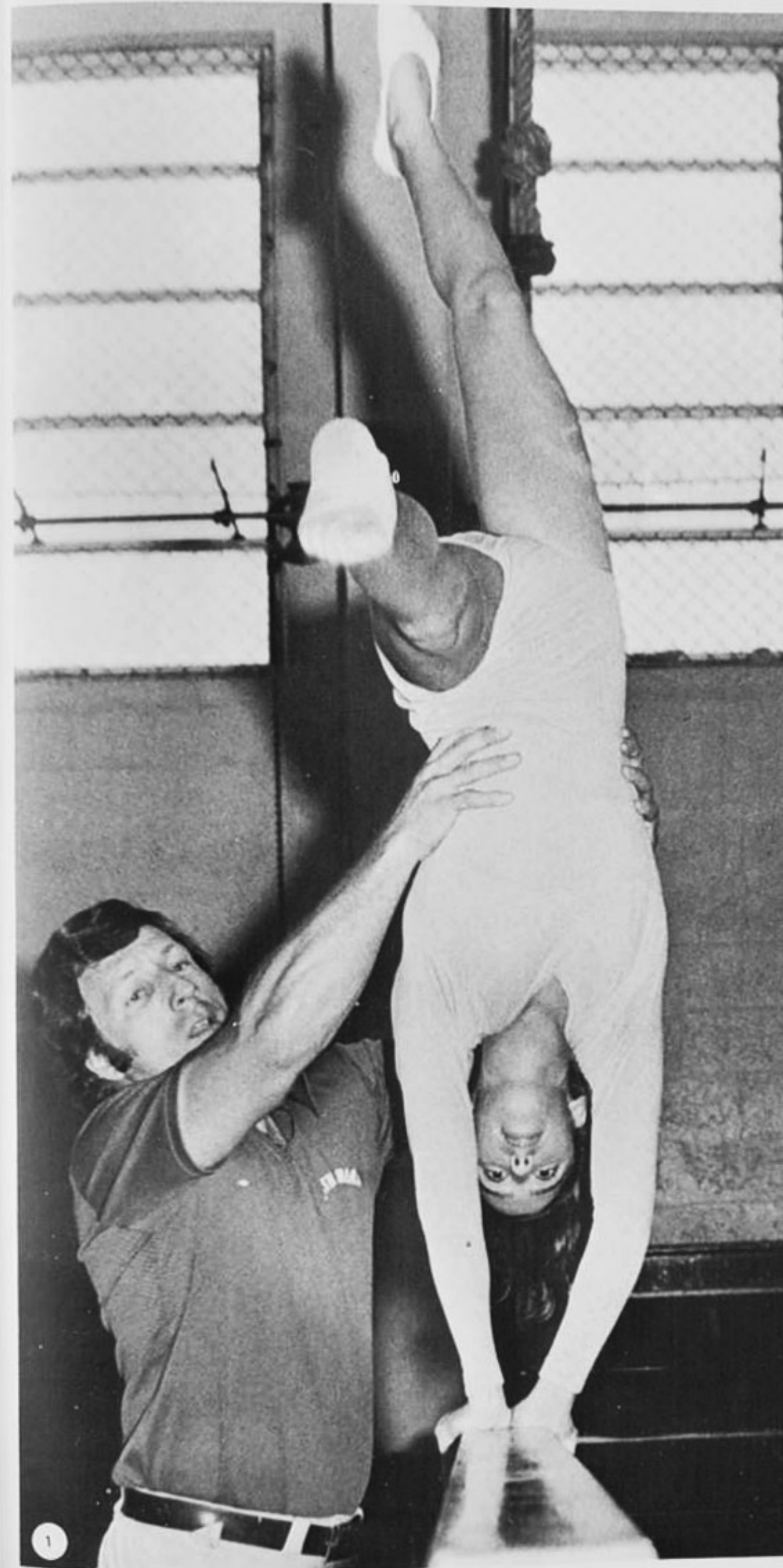

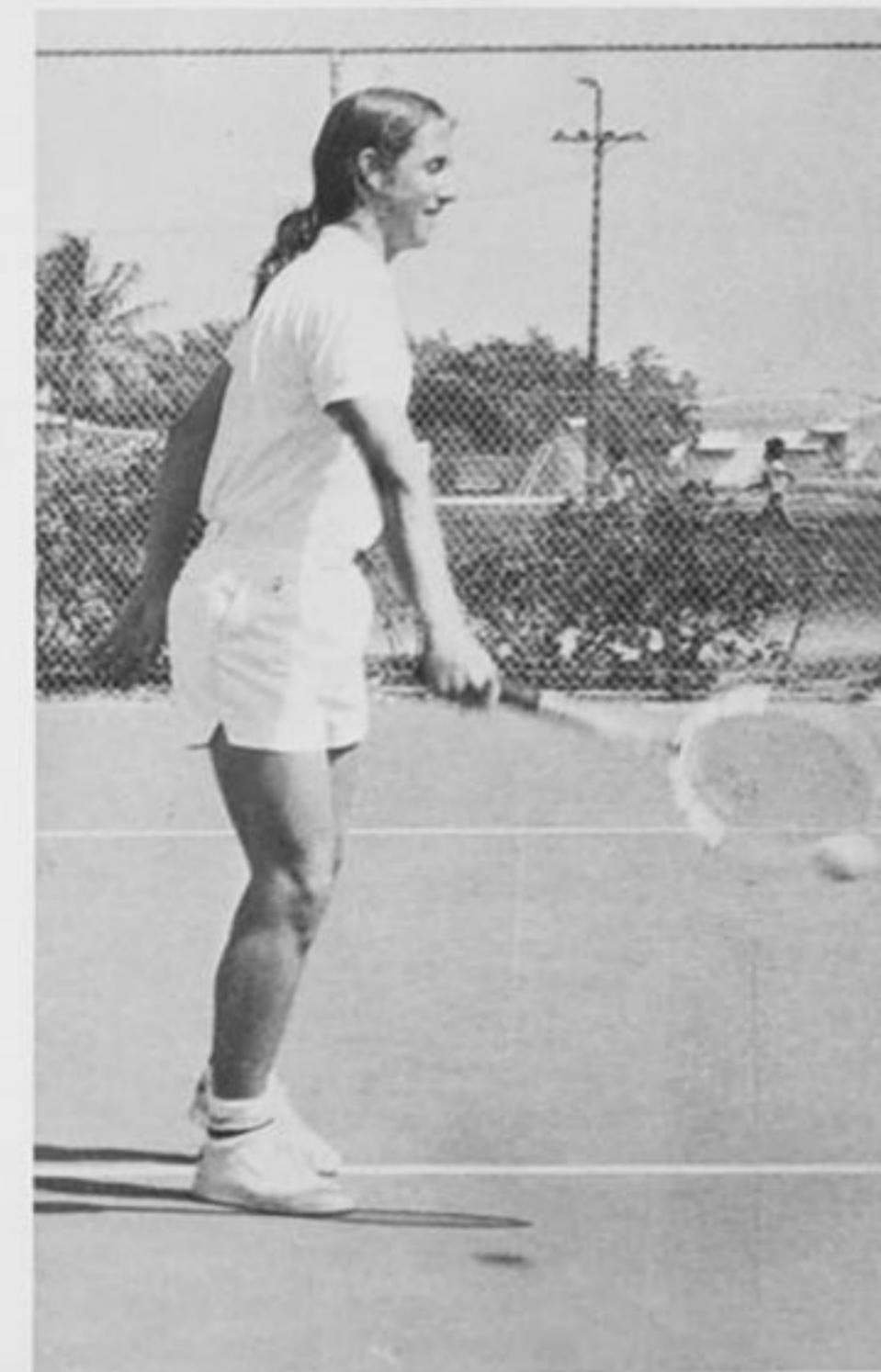

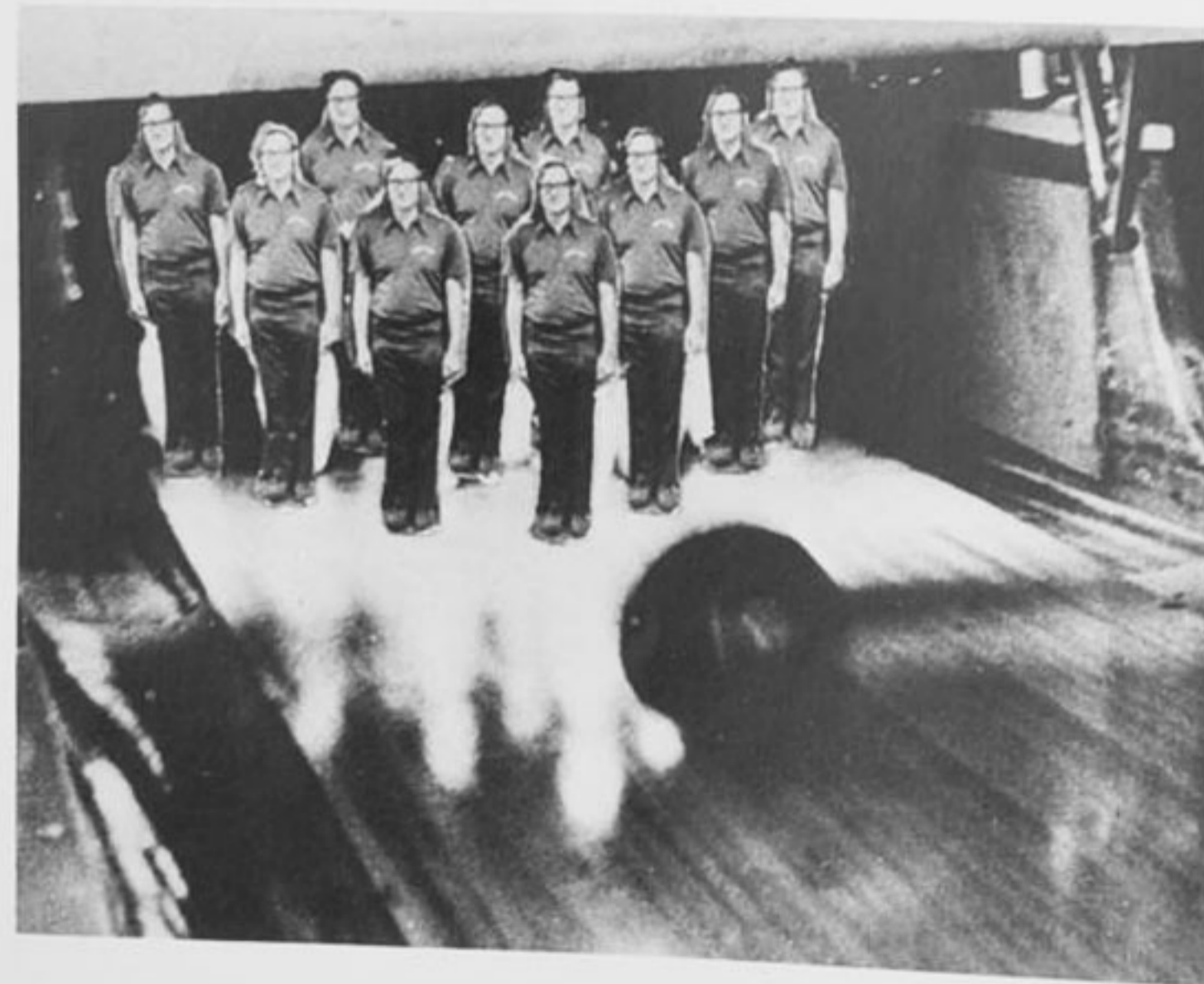

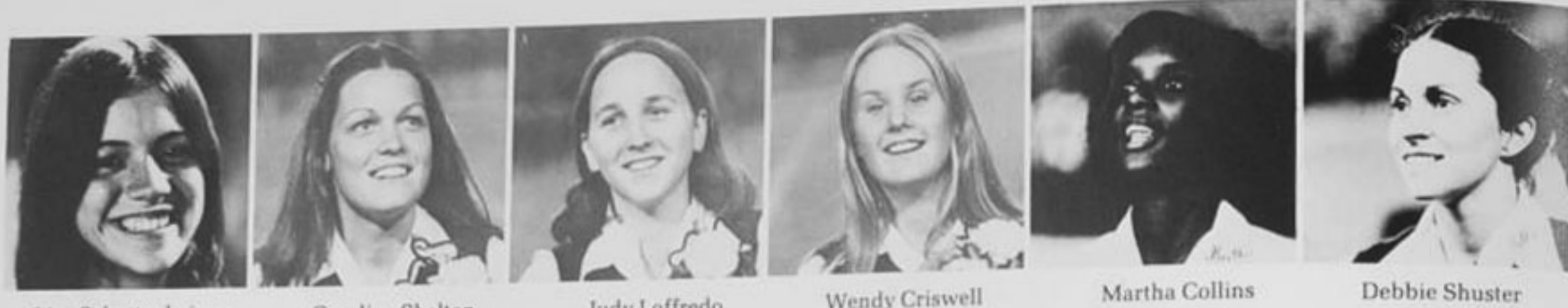

Mr. William Lewis is assistant principal of curriculum as well as the extensive vocational educational program.

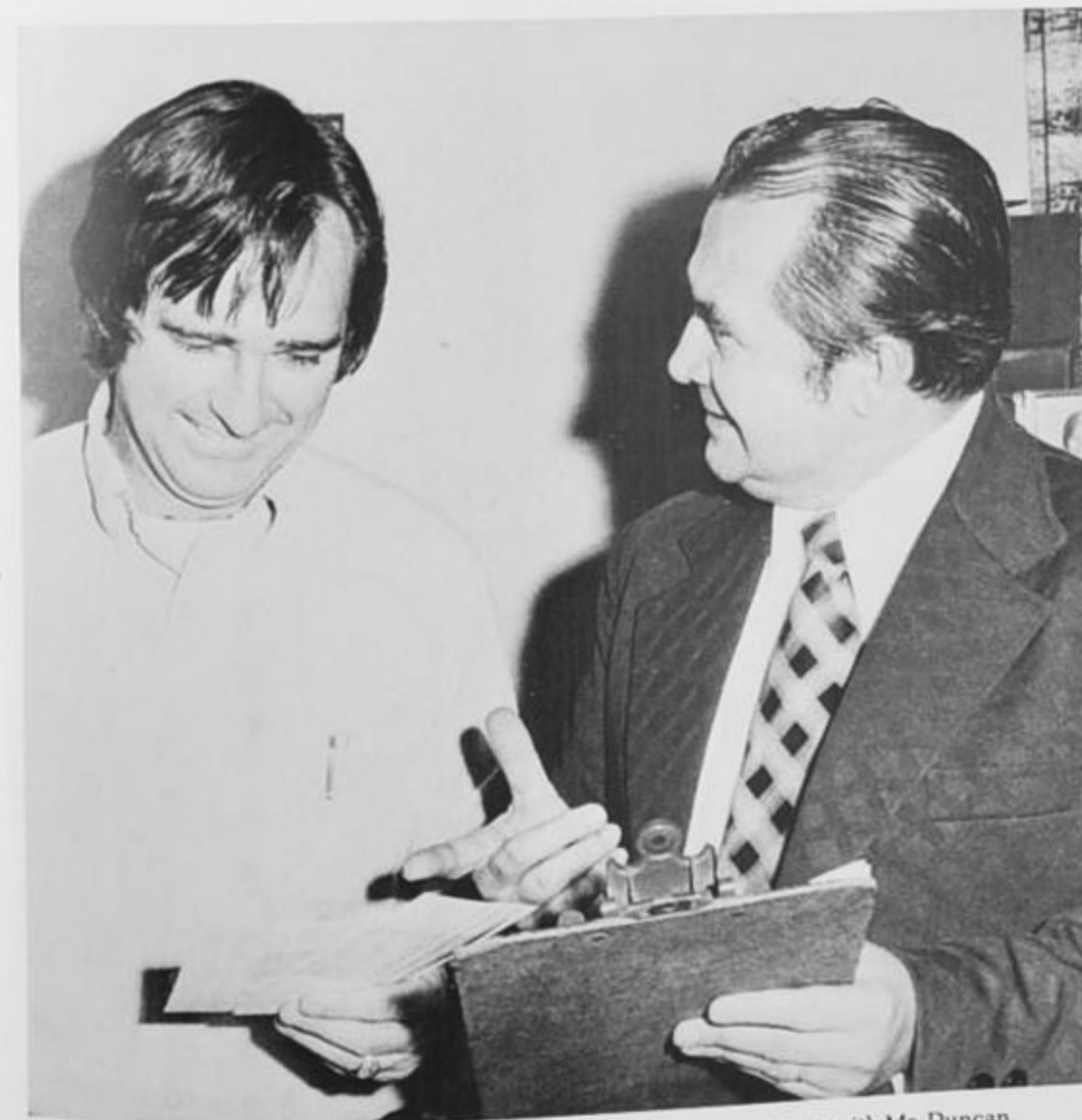

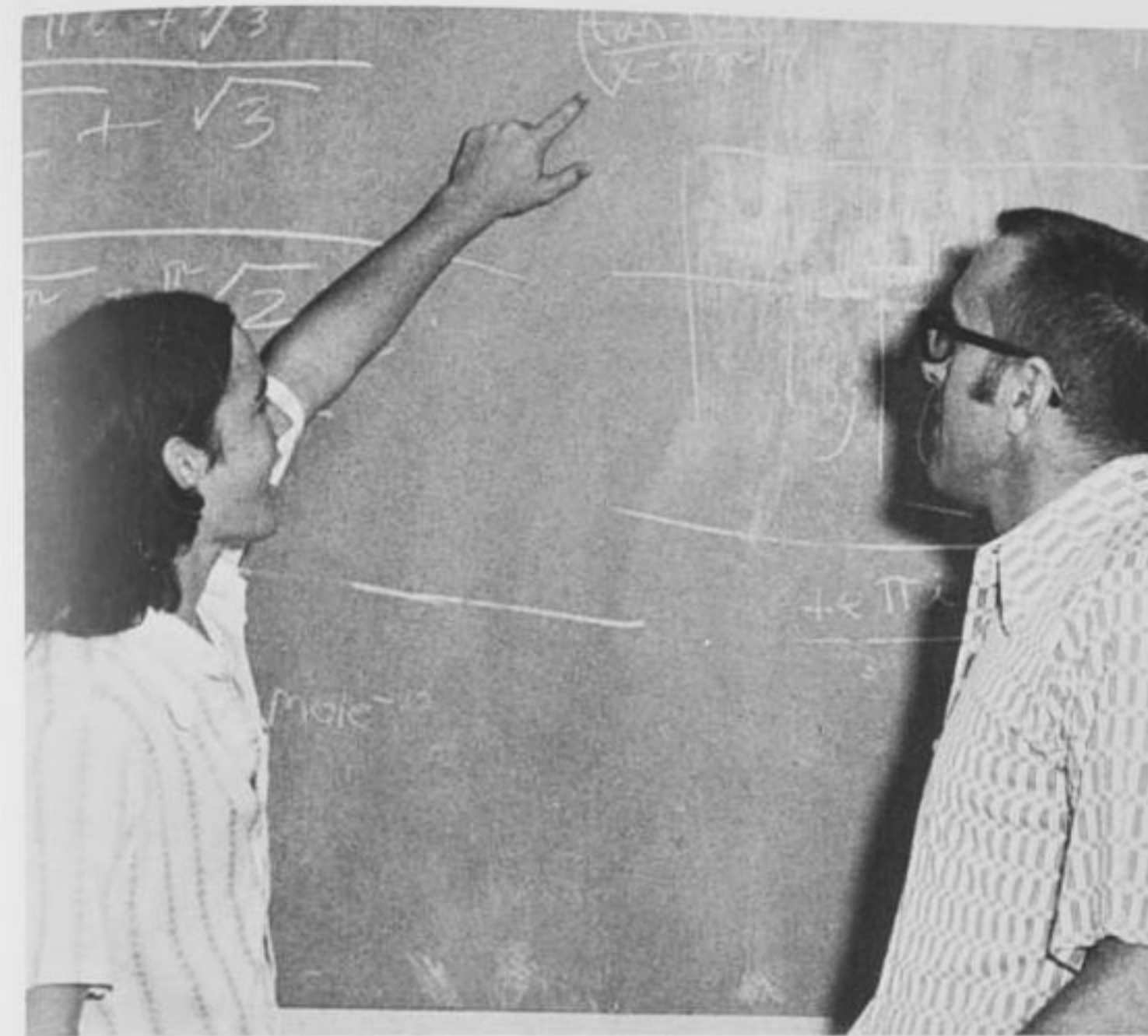

Aviation classes are held at the George T. Baker School of Aviation where students commute by bus. Agriculture classes are at the school farm.

The custodial staff, with Mr. John Gooch, head custodian, worked to keep North Miami clean and in good repair, in addition to keeping the campus attractive.



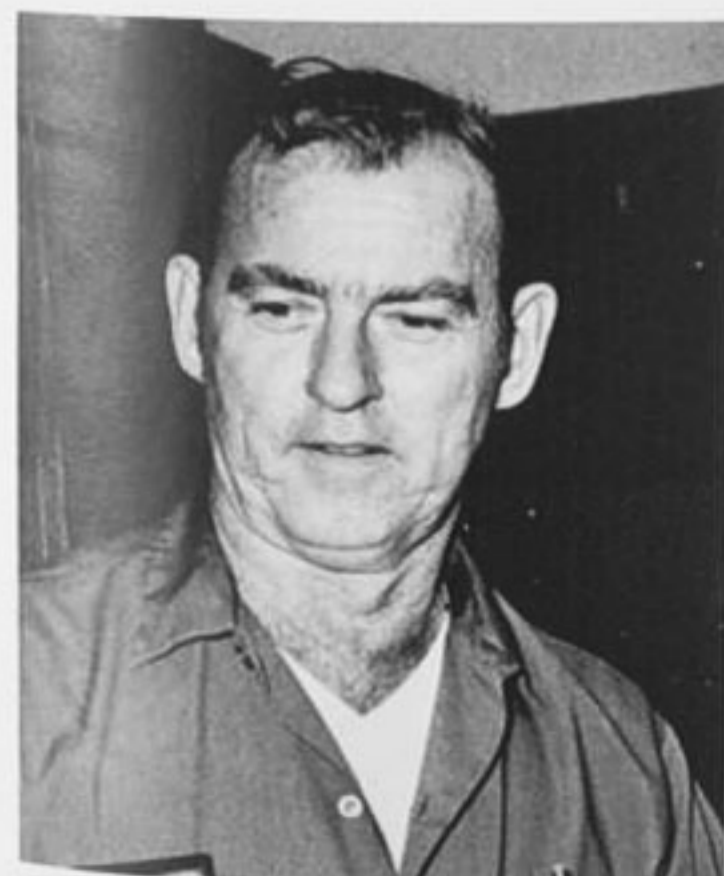

Silver Knight 1974 nominees

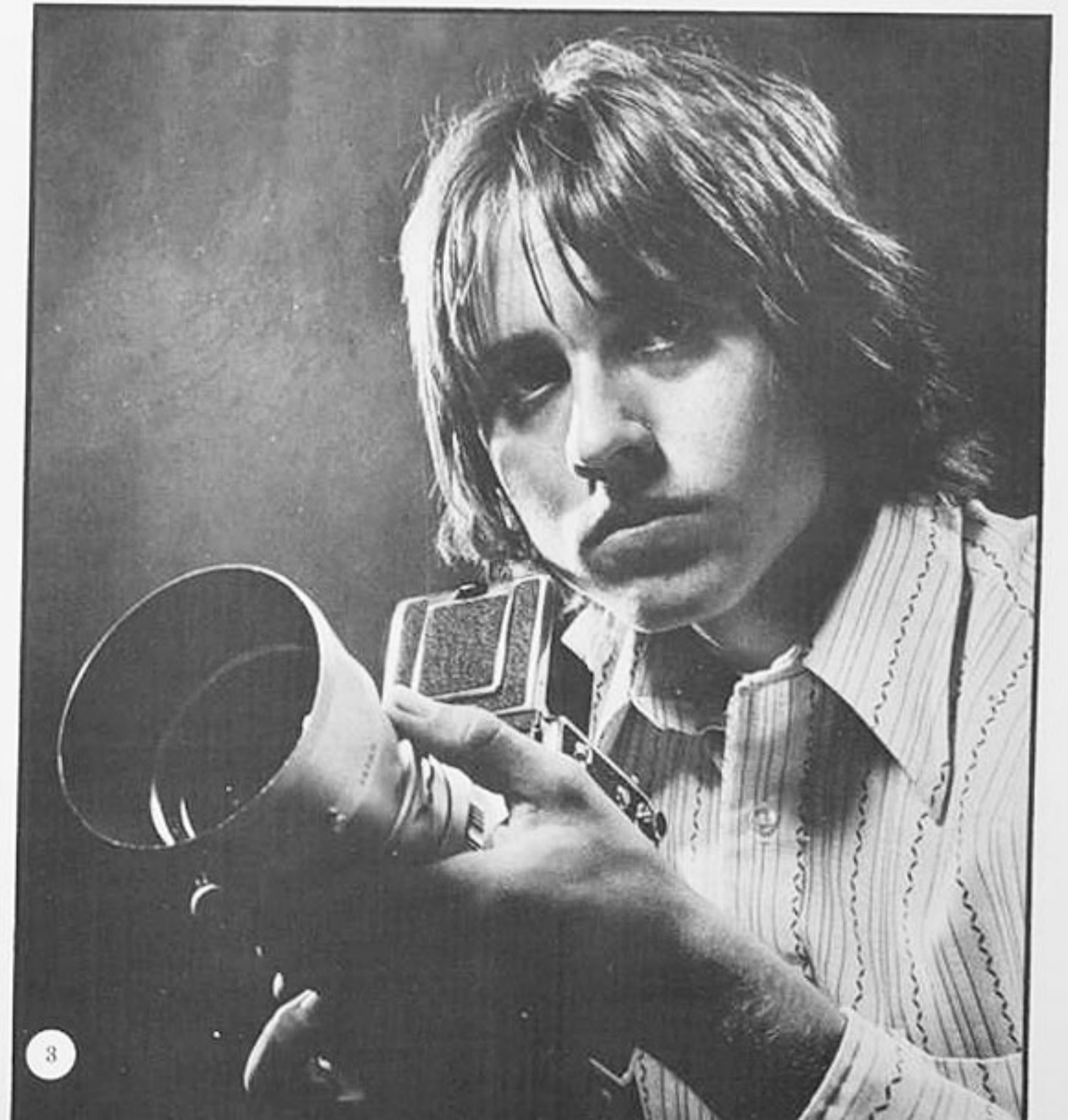

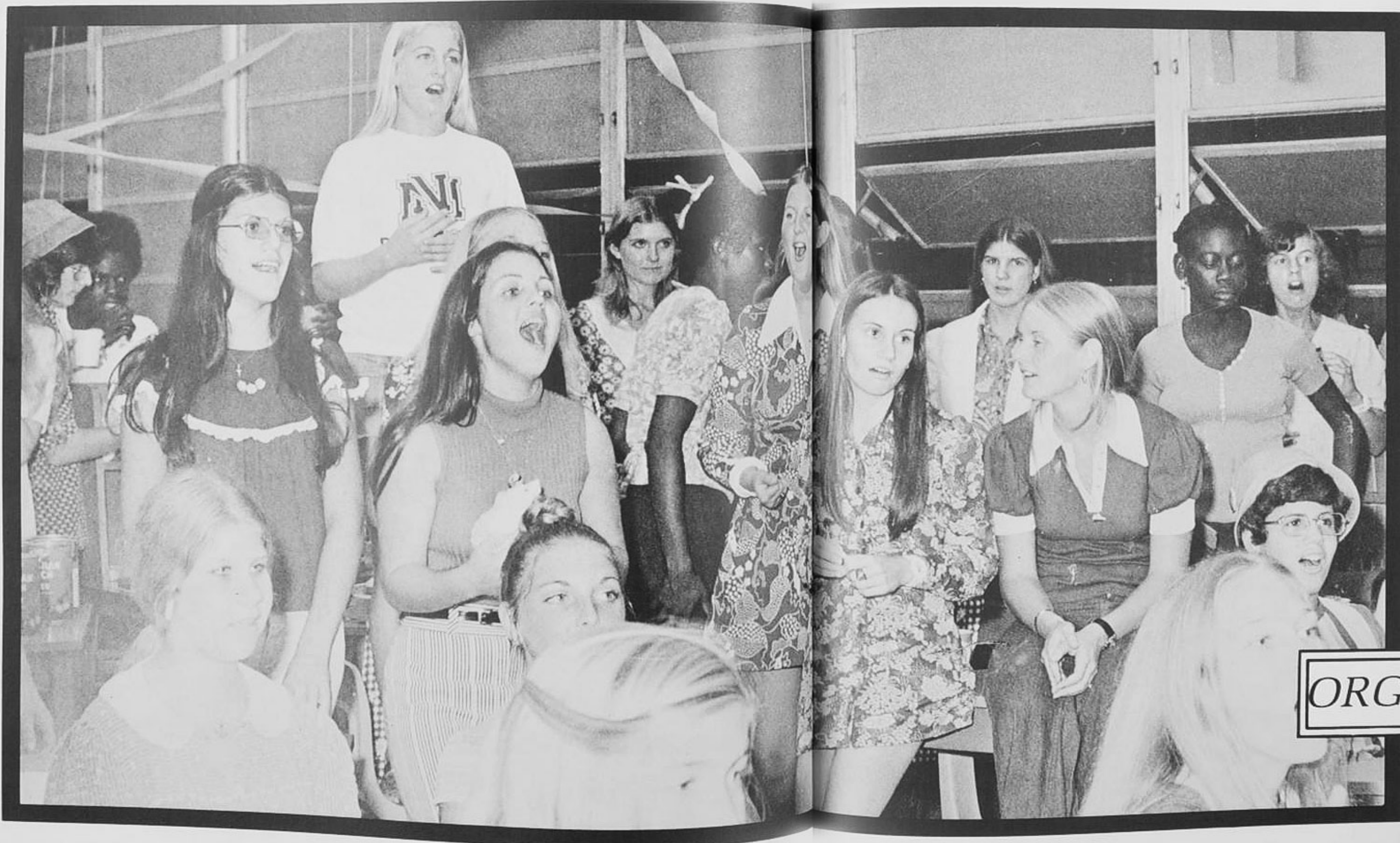

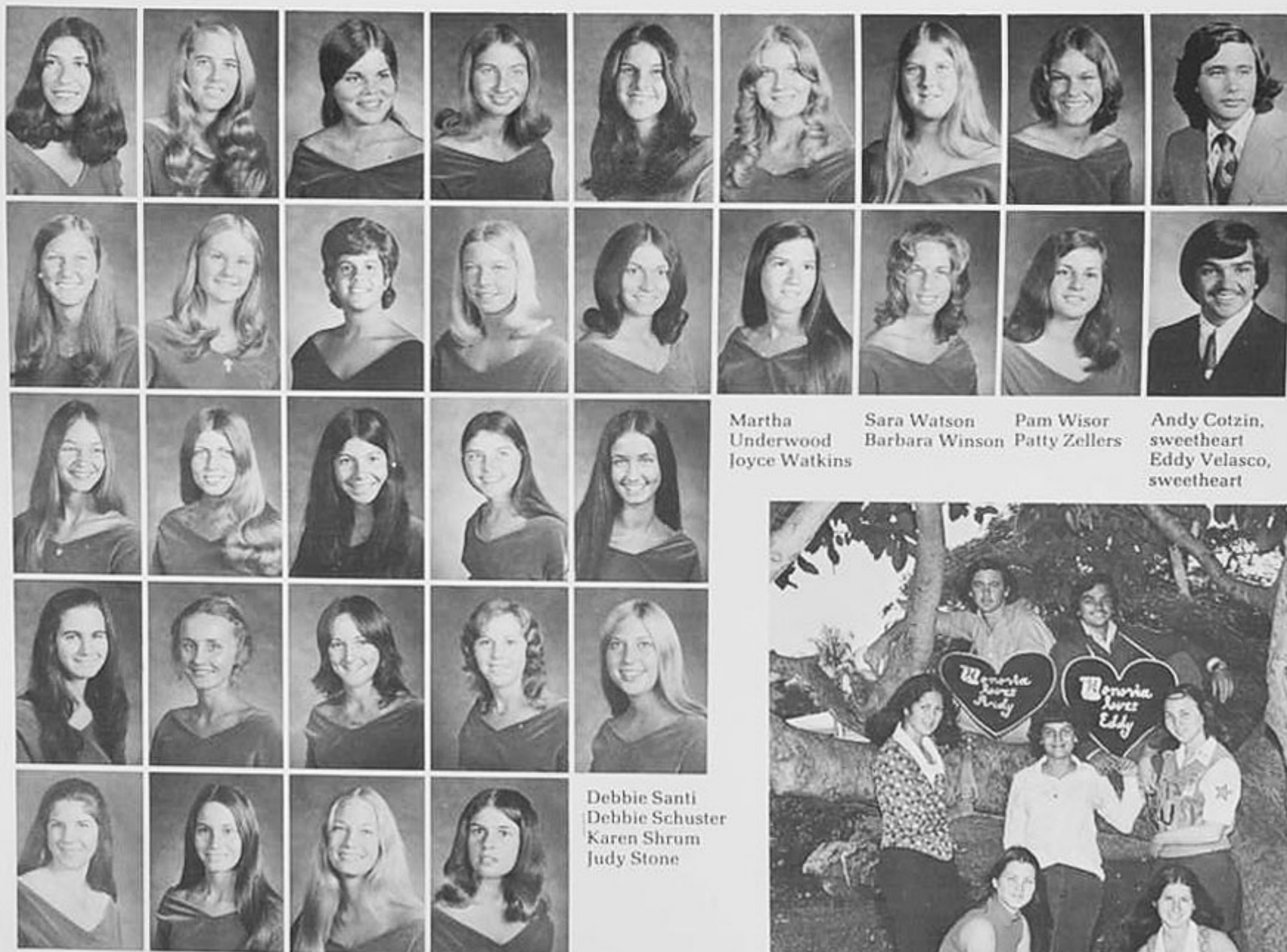
Honoria Members Perform Regular Volunteer Service for Channel 2

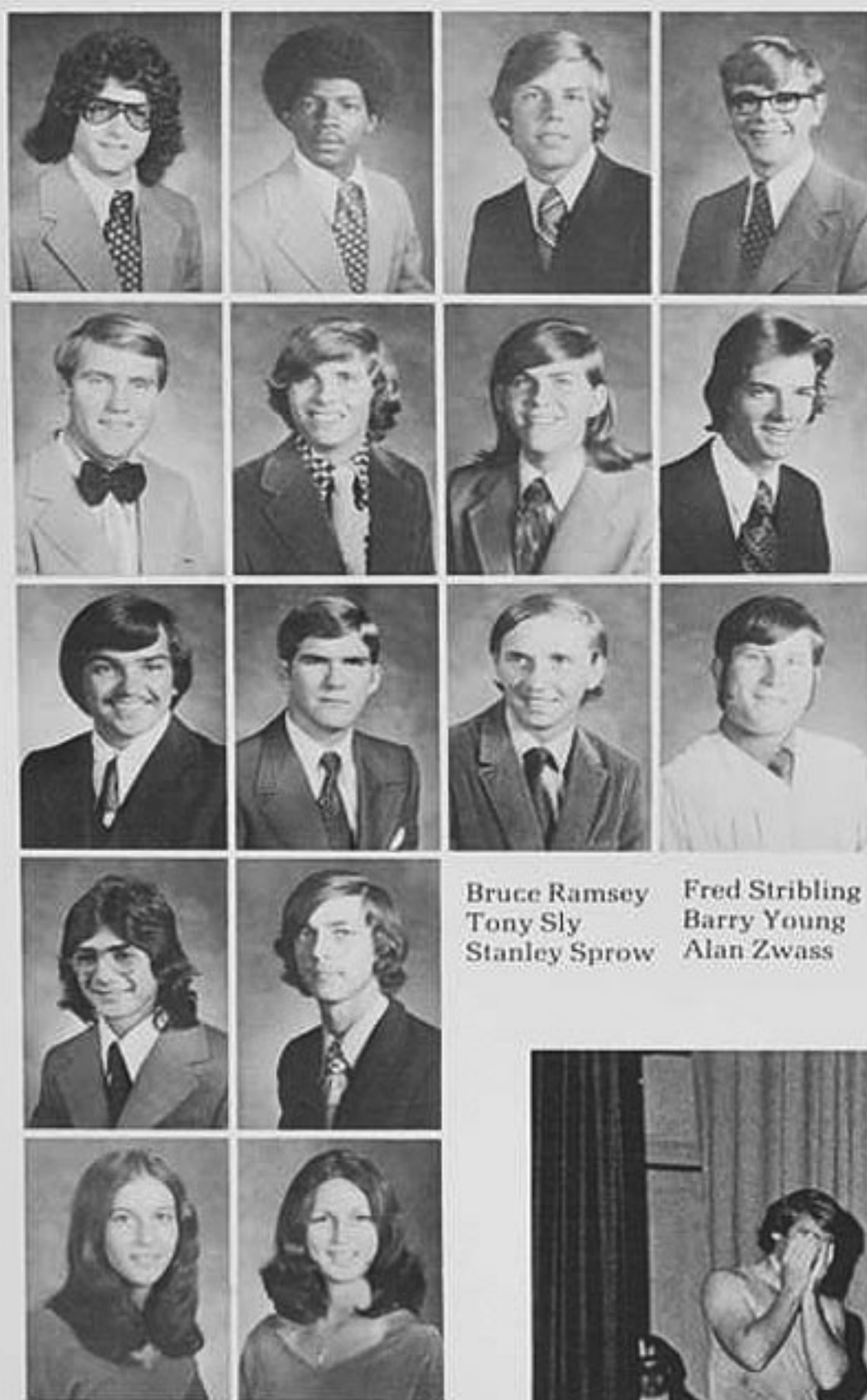
Octagon Brightened Hope School With a New Coat of White Paint

The Pioneers were undefeated in Intramural football, and did well in basketball. Many of the members were active in varsity and JV sports.

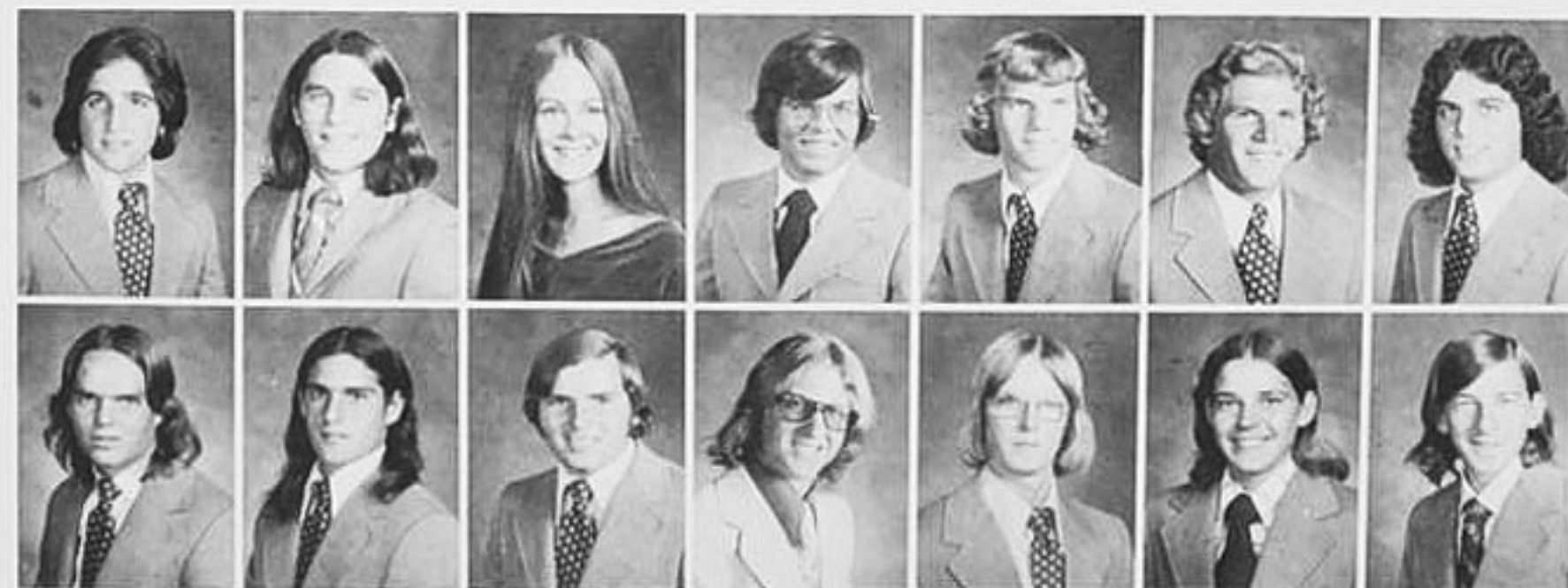

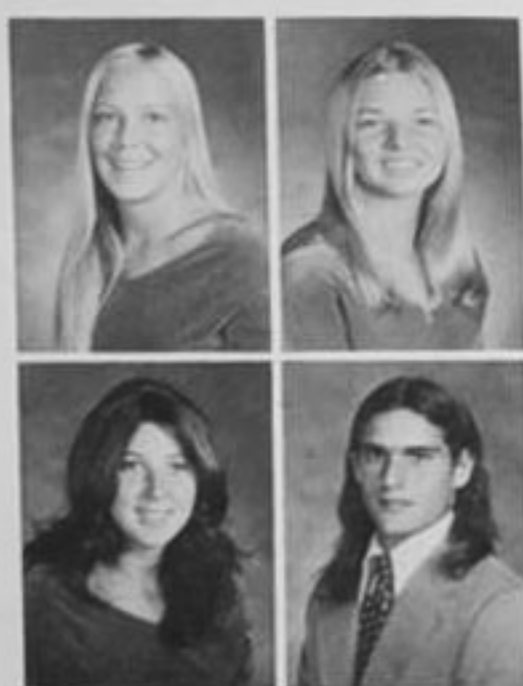

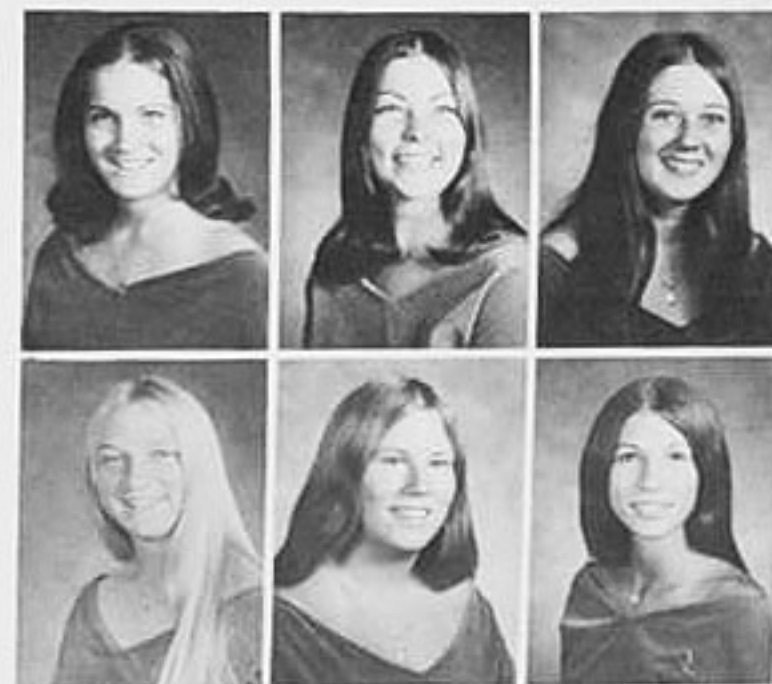

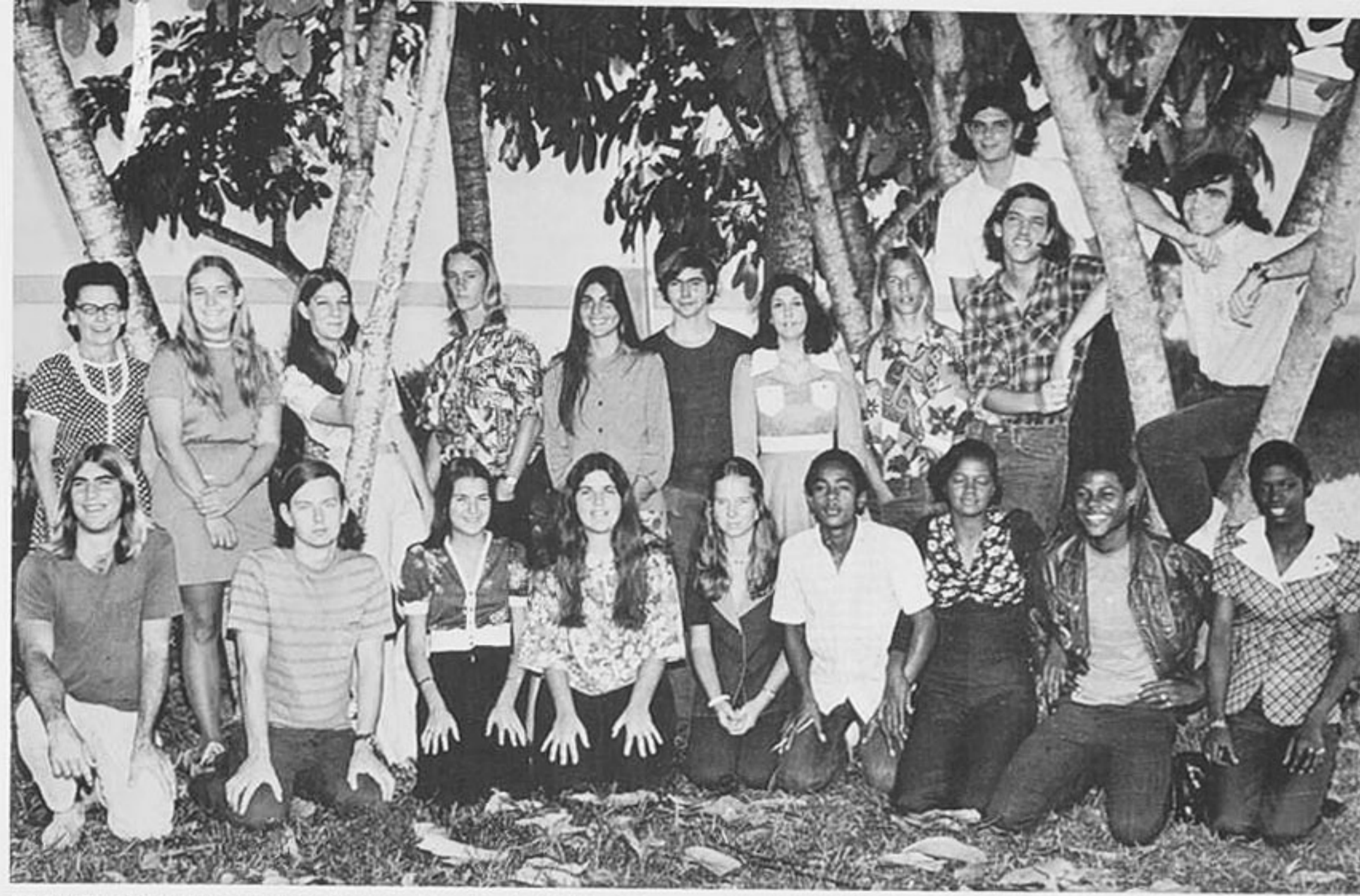
CBE stands for Cooperative Business Education. Students in CBE classes work hard to learn all they can from the world of business.

One division of the FBLA organization was the insurance program fondly named Pioneer Insurance. The course was originally created by members of the insurance industry who felt there was a need for trained and prepared personnel in the secretarial and clerical jobs open to the public.

Throughout the year, students work on learning office procedures and as a conclusion to the course, deserving students are given job opportunities in actual insurance companies.

A section which holds many interests is Machine Mathematics. The class is designed to provide the student with meaningful experiences by integrating the fundamentals of business math and the skills of successfully using machines and calculators to find solutions to problems. Also in this department are courses which teach skills in machine record keeping, bank books, receipts, and check writing, all of which can be done by office machines after completing the class.

Did you ever wonder why there were so many girls engaging in intramural sports after school?

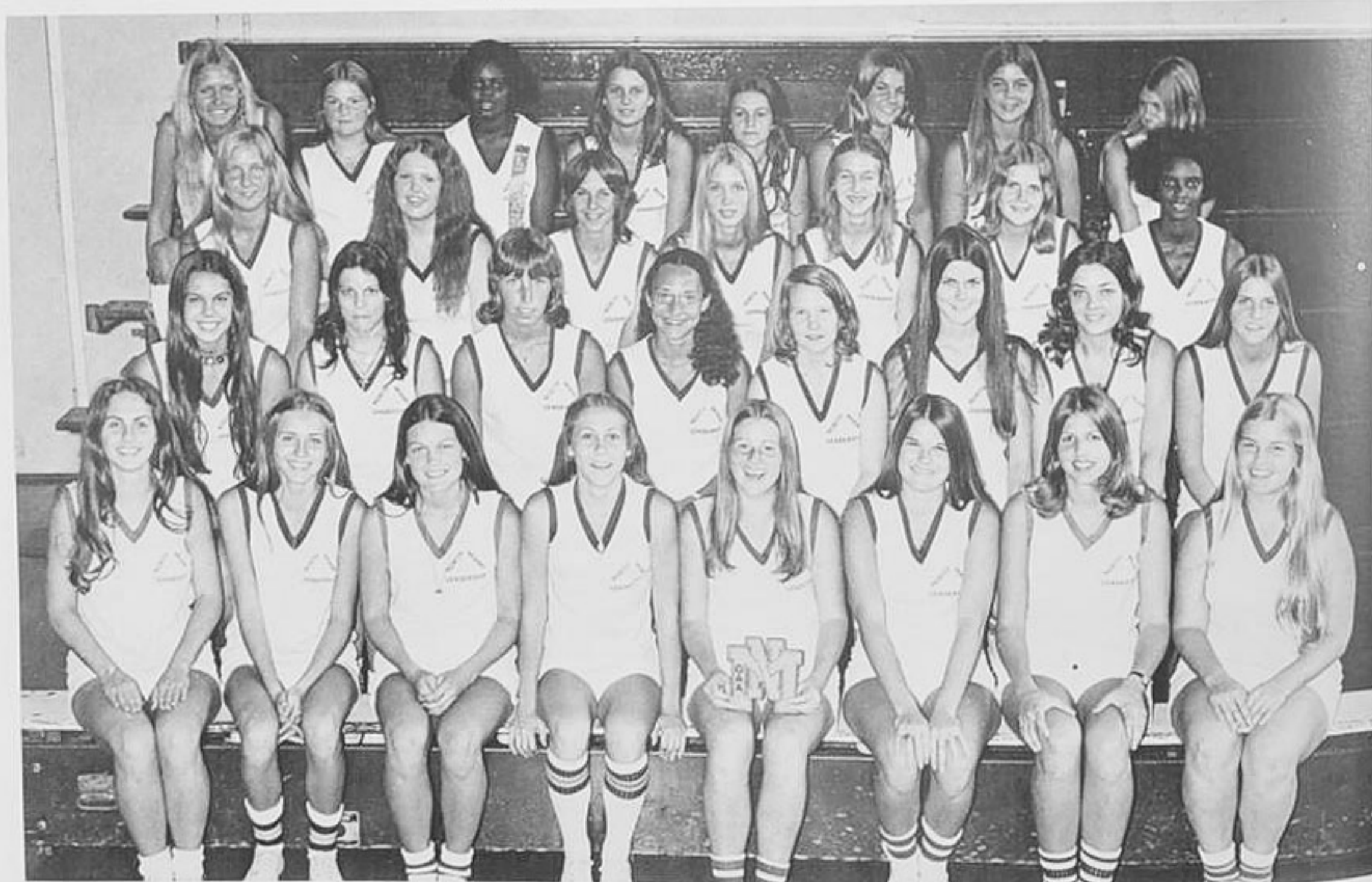
They are all members of GAA, the Girls Athletic Association.

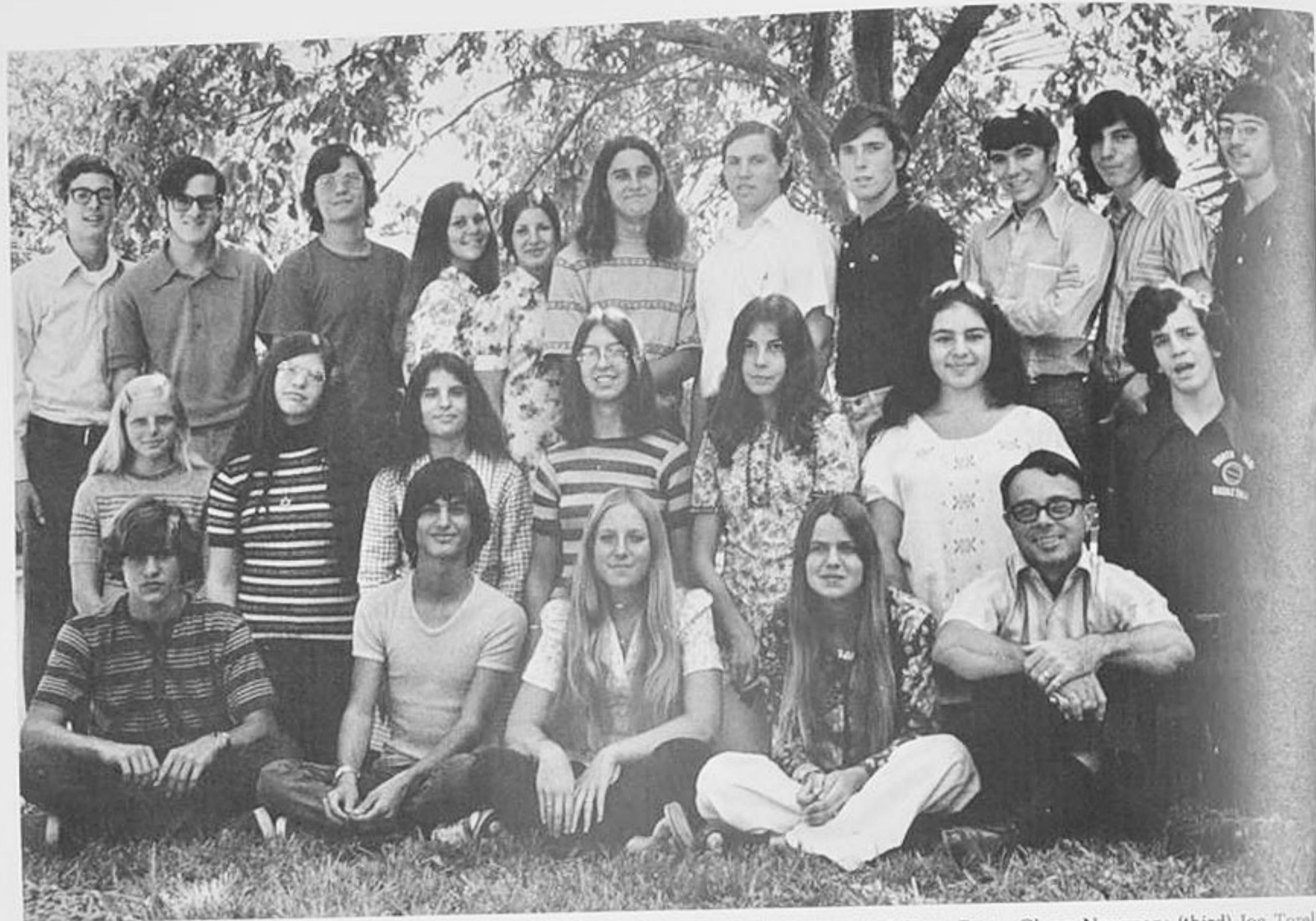

The German language, relatively unknown to the majority of North Miami students, proved to be both interesting and enjoyable to club members and officers.



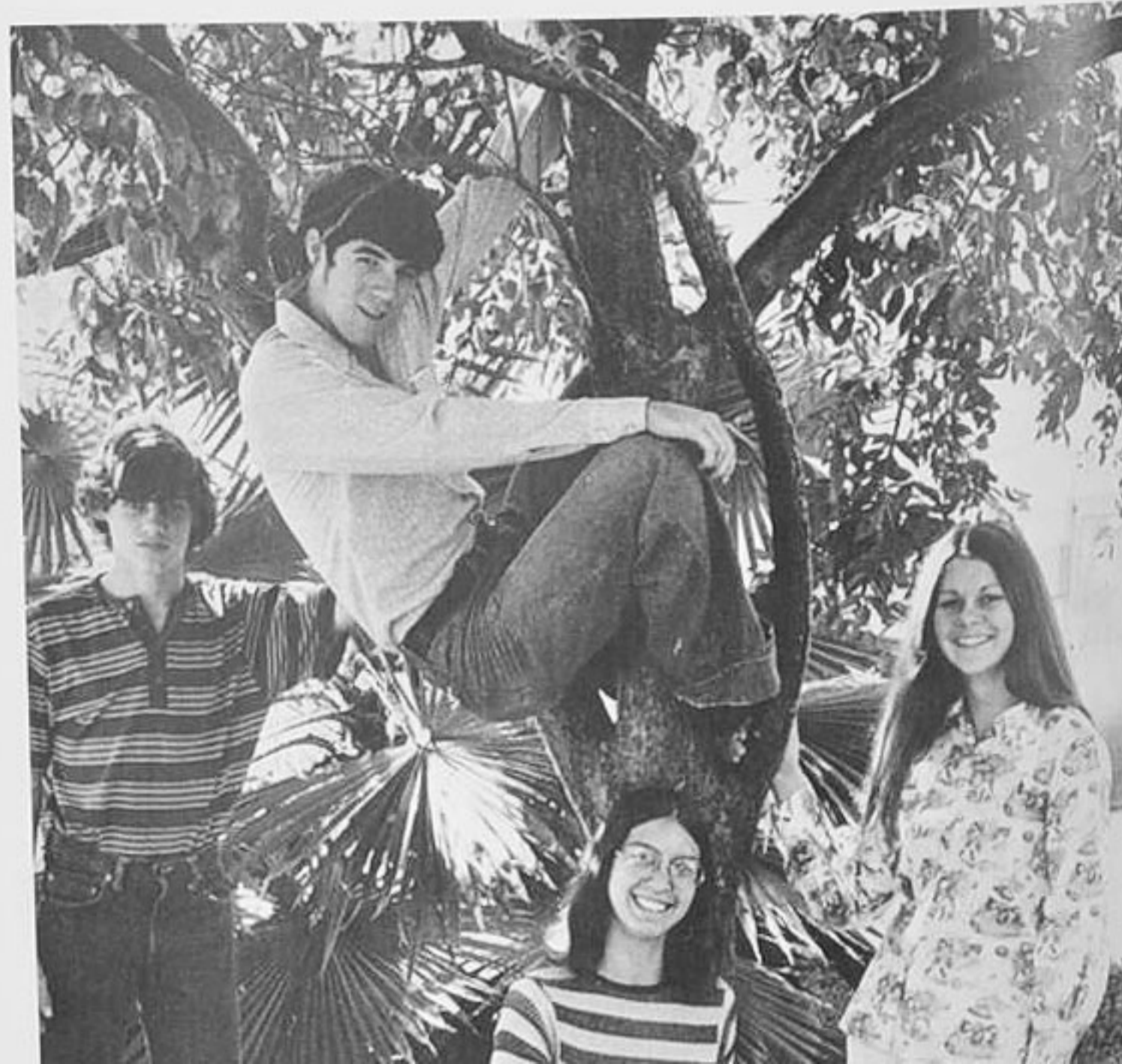

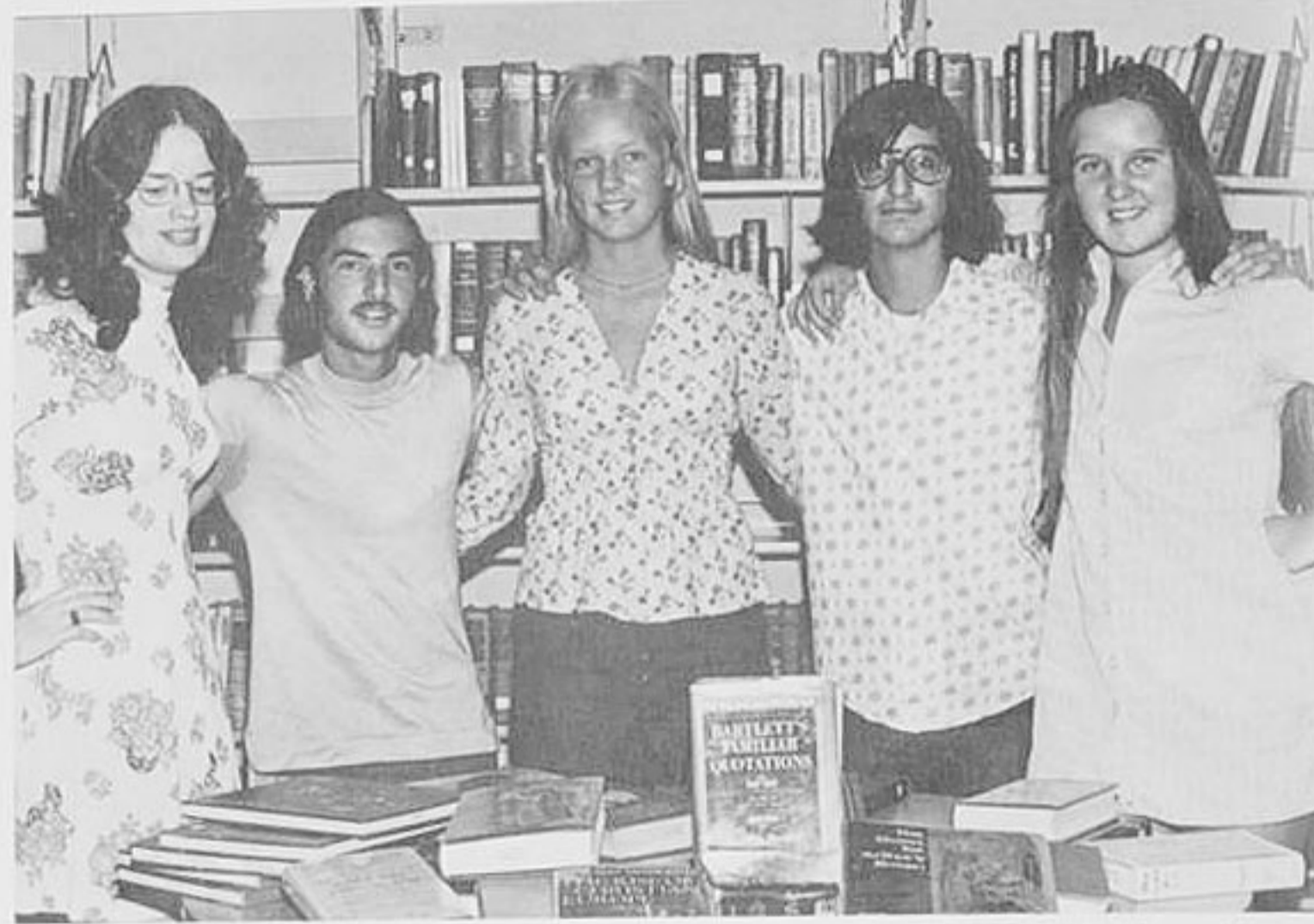

NFL Participates in Tournaments 'Round the Country

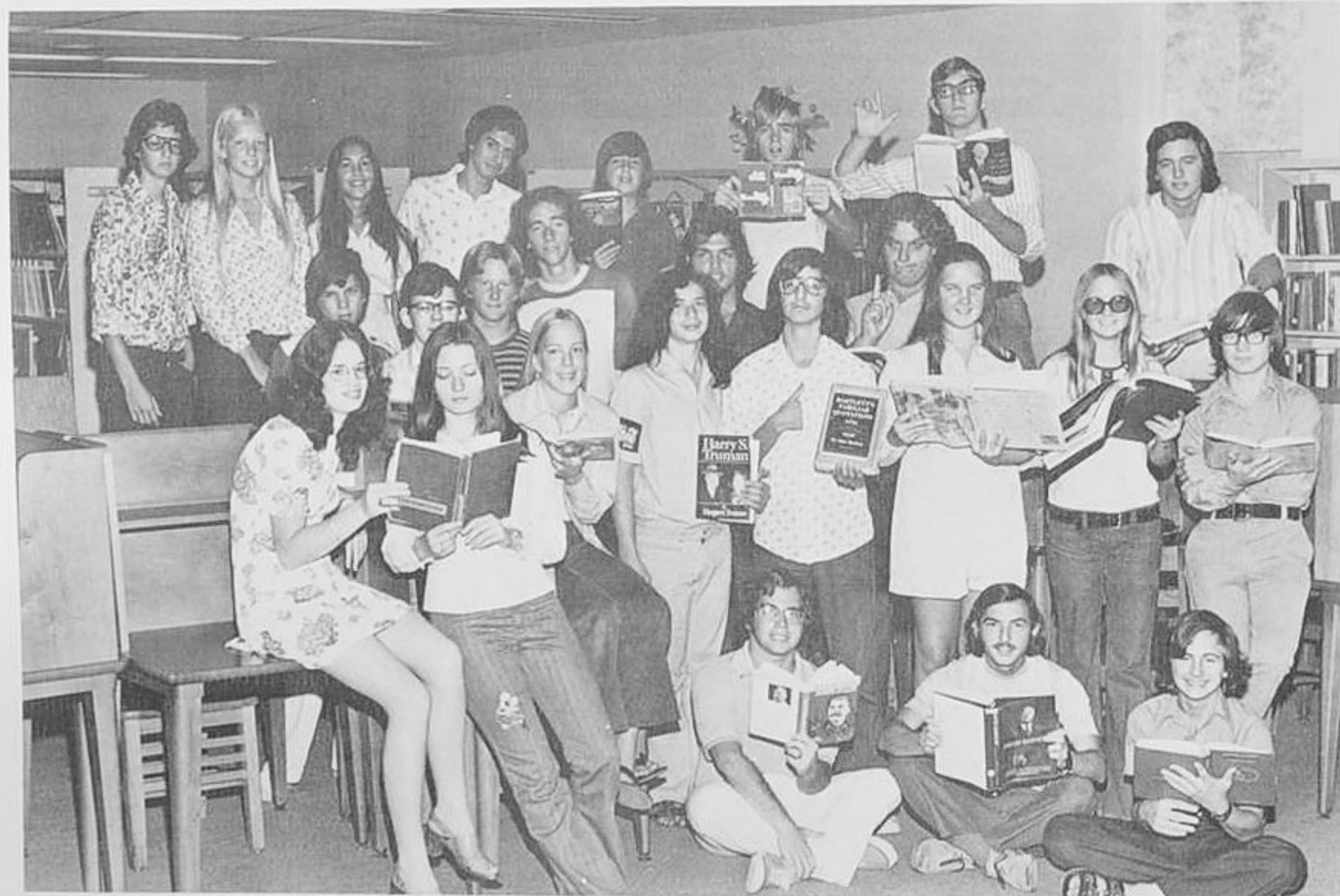

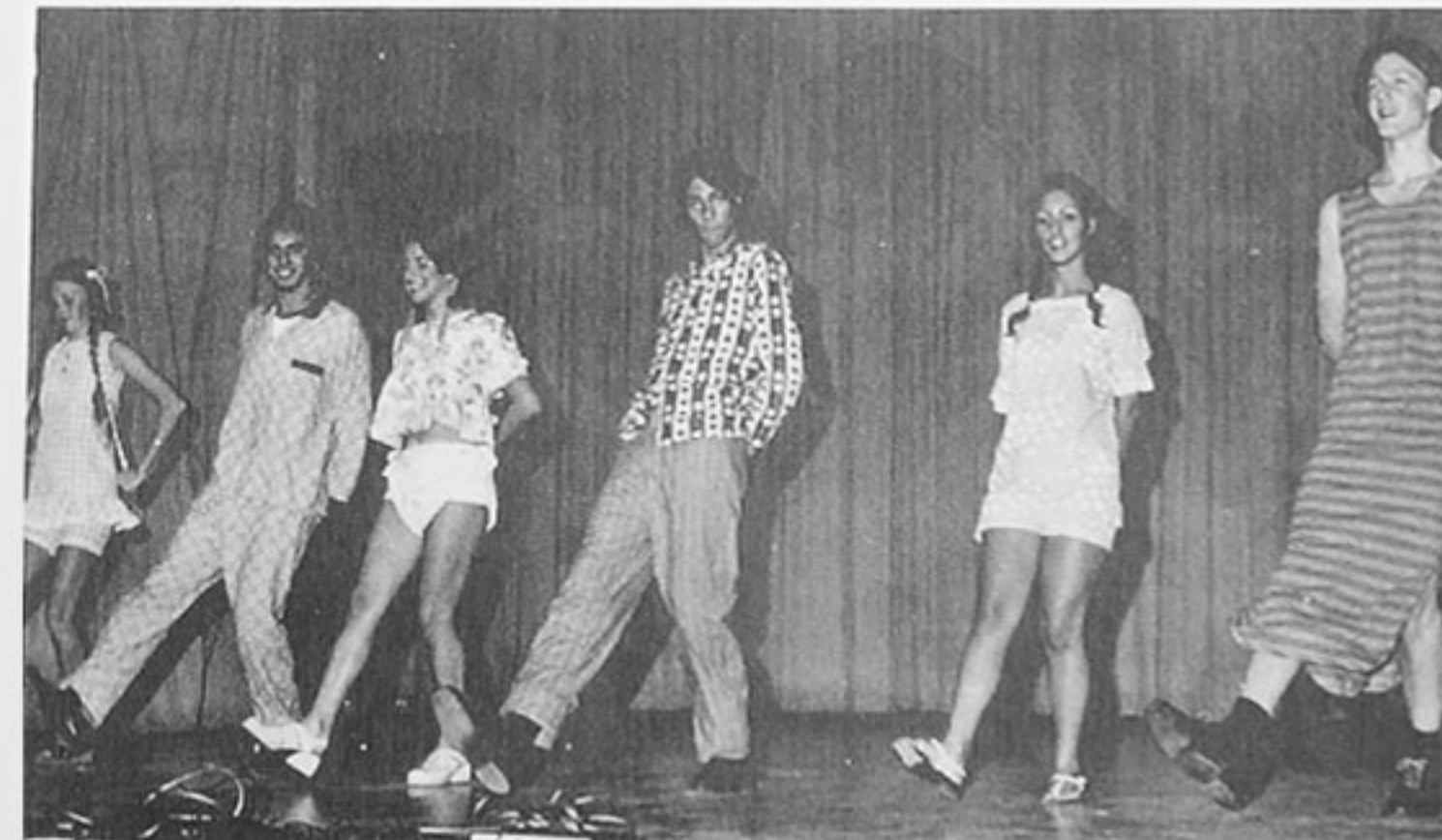
Banding together to explore areas of the dramatic arts, The Pioneer Players had some outstanding productions during the school year.

Pioneers march to the beat of a different drum

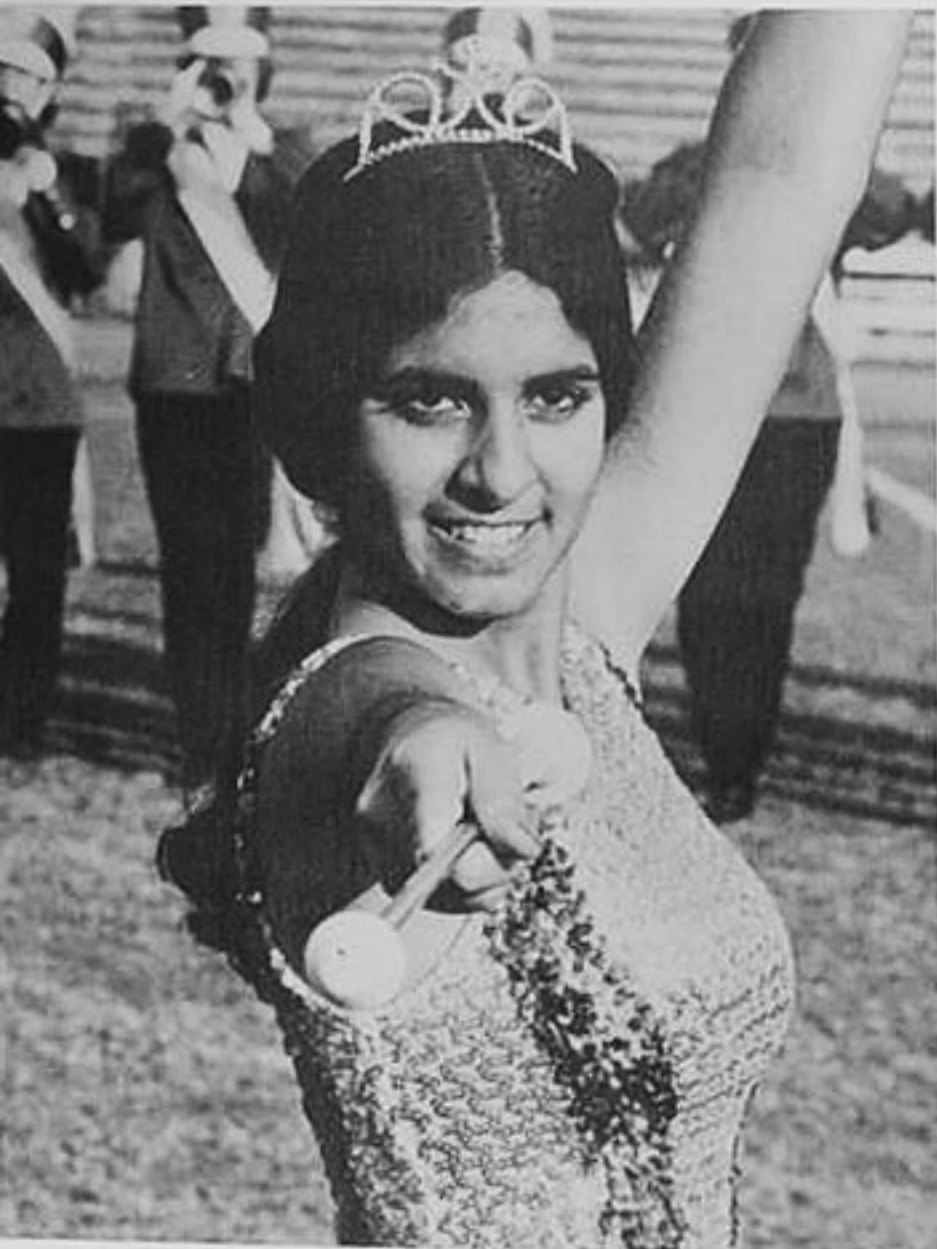
